Miss Brash Won, But It Almost Killed the Kibitzer

Miss Brash's bidding terrified Mr. Meek. He paled visibly when she opened the bidding with four hearts. "Vulnerable against nonvulnerable opponents," he muttered.

Neither Mr. Champion nor his partner could find the values to come into the auction and four hearts became the contract. Mr. Champion led the king of spades when Mrs. Keen flashed the nine spot and continued the suit.

Miss Brash ruffed the second trick, entered dummy with a small diamond to the ace and led back the six of hearts. When Mrs. Keen played low, she promptly finessed the 10.

Mr. Meek couldn't bear to watch. He held his hand over his eyes. When he looked again, he saw that the 10 had held and that Miss Brash, showing no particular elation, was busily cashing her three top trumps to clear the suit. Thus she won five heart tricks, five diamonds and the ace of clubs, making five-odd.

The finesse of the 10 of hearts on the first lead of trumps was somewhat sensational-looking, but a necessary safety play. The prime purpose of the play was not to get trumps out as quickly as possible, although if the 10 held it would be very pleasant. Miss Brash's main idea was to lose the trump trick, if one needed to be lost, at a time when a trump remained on the board.

To put it another way, suppose she had played her three top hearts as soon as she got in, hoping they broke 3-3. Then if they did not break, the only play would be to try and run the diamonds. The defender holding the good jack of trumps would ruff specifically the third lead of diamonds and return a heart. Ruffing this heart would take Miss Brash's last trump and then she would end up leading from her club holding.

Rail Crossings Under Study By Board

OTTAWA (CP)-The Board of Transport Commissioners is investigating railway crossings and what should be done to eliminate accidents. A panel headed by Mr. Justice John D. Kearley now is discussing the matter with provincial and municipal officials in meetings across Canada. Their findings and recommendations will be presented to the government for action.

During the last session of Parliament George Murray, Liberal member for Cariboo in British Columbia, introduced a private bill making it compulsory to eliminate level crossings for any new railway construction. The bill was not considered before Parliament prorogued.

Explaining the bill, Mr. Murray said in an interview: "Why spend money to create death traps?"
A report prepared for the Transport Board on railway crossing accidents shows that the rate appears to follow the increase in automobile registrations. Until 1920, killed and injured at urban crossings were almost equal to those in rural areas. But as more automobiles moved into the country with the coming of better roads, accidents at rural crossings began to exceed those in urban districts.

Since 1925, 2,253 persons have been killed at rural crossings; 800 at urban crossings. In 1950, the last year for which figures are available, there were 54 killed and 254 injured at urban crossings; 87 killed and 224 injured at suburban.
Board figures show that 93.9 per cent of all rural crossings were not protected in 1950 compared with 71.1 per cent of urban crossings.
