BLACKWOOD on Bridge

Mr. Meek Lays Foundation for Squeeze
A bolder player, Miss Brash for example, might have tried three no trump on the South cards after Mrs. Keen's three diamond bid. But not Mr. Meek. He made a nice bid of three hearts, inviting his partner to bid game at no trump if she had a club stopper.

But Mrs. Keen elected to bid four diamonds and Mr. Meek carried on to five. Mr. Abel cashed the king and ace of clubs and led a third club to Mr. Muzzy's queen. Mr. Meek ruffed the third trick and stopped a moment to check on his prospects.

He knew that a squeeze on a player in two suits will produce only one additional winner. For the squeeze to work you must have all the tricks you need except one. On this hand Mr. Meek had contracted for 11 tricks and could take 10—five diamonds, two spades, two hearts and a heart ruff.

Would a squeeze operate if Mr. Abel happened to be his side's only guardian of the black suits? Well, Mr. Abel would have to hold one club to top dummy's 10. If he held a spade stopper, it was a third round winner and therefore he would have to hold three spades. That made four essential cards in all.

Three tricks had been played and Mr. Meek could win the next seven outside of the spade suit; that is, four diamonds, two hearts and a heart ruff. That made 10 tricks and everybody would be down to three cards.

Yes, the squeeze would be successful if Mr. Abel had the jack of clubs and queen, jack of spades or any four spades. Beginning with trick four, then, Mr. Meek cashed two top diamonds. Then he cashed the ace and king of hearts and

ruffed a heart. Next, he played his two remaining trumps, discarding two small spades from the board. On the last trump Mr. Abel was reduced to the jack of clubs and three spades to the queen. Dummy's 10 of clubs was still staring him in the face, so he discarded a spade. Mr. Meek then won the last three tricks in the spade suit.

Serves Dual Purpose at Manitoba RCAF Camp
MACDONALD, Man. (CP)—R.C. A.F. crews from No. 2 Construction maintenance unit are busy here correcting an expensive lesson learned in the Second World War.

A \$1,000,000 housing project being built is almost as mobile as the station's aircraft yet will be permanent living quarters as long as there's a need for them.

One and two-apartment buildings, made of prefabricated steel can be erected in one day. Sgdn. Ldr. W. Riddell, officer in charge of the project, calls them "giant meccano sets."

The buildings can be converted into barrack blocks and can be knocked down and carted to new sites. This is an asset in wartime, when defence centres can spring up almost overnight.

Even beams, made of pre-cast concrete, can be used again in setting the buildings up in a new district.

Apartments in the 100 units when completed will contain up to six bedrooms, depending on size of family. All useless corners have been eliminated and soundproof walls will separate each unit.

The housing project is part of a \$10,000,000 building program to be done by the RCAF this year-families are expected to be able to move into their new quarters by fall.
