## THE EXPERTS Say...

A bachelor was quoted the other day as saying you can always spot a good housekeeper by the way she peels potatoes. He explained that thick peelings are a dead give-away for the wasteful homemaker, and a sloppy one is known by the number of eyes she leaves in the spuds.

So it's good advice to peel your potatoes cleanly and thinly. The critical bachelor might be tempted by the following dish:

POTATOES AU GRATIN  
Butter a shallow baking-dish and into it slice eight medium-sized potatoes which have been partially cooked. They should be firm and waxy. As you slice, sprinkle 2½ cups grated old cheese between the layers and on top. Also sprinkle these layers with salt and pepper. Dot the top with butter and add enough skim milk almost to cover the top layer. Bake at 400 degrees Fahrenheit until milk is nearly absorbed and potatoes are tender 30 minutes approximately.

SMART FISH SALADS  
Housewives who serve their families with fish salads at least once or twice weekly help to keep Canada's fisheries department happy. A department booklet contains a recipe for tuna crunch salad which sounds like a good thing for this time of the year.

Ingredients: One seven-ounce tin Canadian tuna; one-quarter cup chopped green pepper; one tablespoon minced onion; two cups crisp shredded cabbage; two tablespoons vinegar; salad dressing; two cups potato chips. Add green pepper, minced onion, cabbage and vinegar to flaked tuna. Add salad dressing to moisten. Just before serving add potato chips and toss lightly together. Serve on crisp greens. Yield: six servings.

Other salad combinations: A slice of cold cooked salmon with cucumber, tomato, hard cooked egg slices and celery curls. Diced pineapple, apple, celery, flaked lobster, mayonnaise, lettuce. Sardines, diced beets and potatoes sliced eggs, dressing and lettuce. Flaked fish, peas, cucumber, tomato, dressing, lettuce.

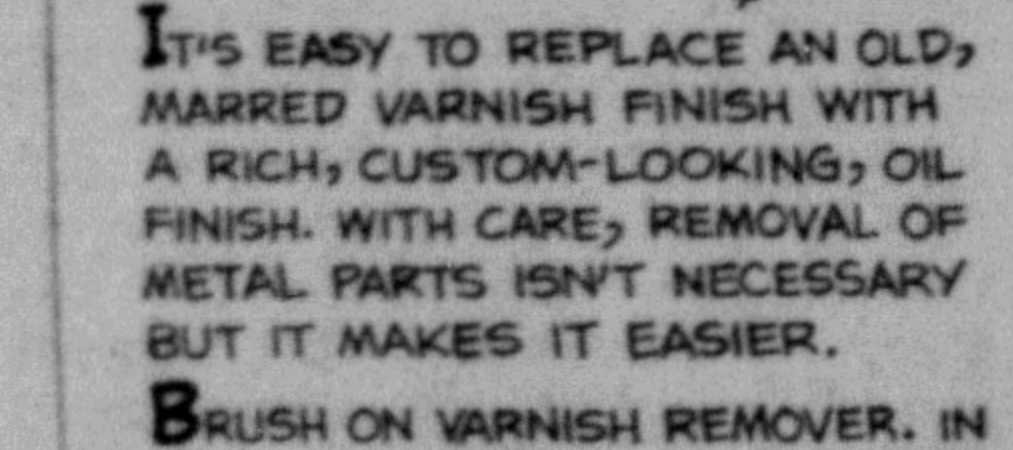

### Mr. Masters Follows the Old Tactic of Delayed Attack

Mr. Muzzy was sitting behind Mr. Masters in today's deal and he raised his eyebrows over Mr. Masters' pass on the first round of bidding. Mr. Masters would have been right in there with a bid of two hearts. And in this particular deal, he probably would have reached the same final contract, namely four hearts.

The point is, however, that Mr. Masters' method of bidding the hand gave him an important safety factor—without jeopardizing his chances of reaching the eventual game contract.

Suppose, for example, Mr. Dale held an absolute minimum opening and no heart support. What would he do over a two-heart bid by Mr. Masters? Having opened the bidding, first hand, he was obligated to bid again. If the North-South cards happened to be a misfit, trouble was just around the corner.

As you see, Mr. Masters had no difficulty making the heart game, but after the play was completed Mr. Muzzy commented: "You took an awful chance of missing that game when you passed on the first round, Masters."

"I took practically no chance," replied Mr. Masters, smiling.

"Well, what if Dale had not bid again?" asked Mr. Muzzy.

"In that case," said Mr. Masters, "the odds are overwhelming that we could make no game. It was only after I found out my partner had an over-minimum opening and was willing to force me to bid, that I could afford to make a strong bid on my cards. You say you would have bid two hearts on the first round. I ask you how did you know Dale had good heart support and a lone spade?"

"Well..." began Mr. Muzzy. "Exactly the answer I expected," said Mr. Masters. "You didn't know. Then why not let him tell you? With what he actually held, he doubled for me to bid. Change his hand to a singleton heart and three spades to the queen and he would have passed out on one spade. And if he had those holdings in the major suits, how would you like to be playing four hearts?"
