## Former Polish Lawyer Becomes Red Cross Nurse to Meet Women

TORONTO (CP)—A former Polish lawyer, Mrs. Mary Kindler, wanted to become more thor-  
oughly acquainted with Cana-  
dian women so she took up Red  
Cross home nursing.

Recently she was one of 285  
women to receive awards from  
the Red Cross at ceremony here.  
Mrs. Kindler's work in Poland  
was mainly concerned with chil-  
dren's guardianship and delin-  
quents. During the war she was  
active in the underground and  
afterwards spent two years in  
Sweden doing industrial work.

She married a lawyer who was  
serving with Polish troops in  
England and later they came to  
Canada. She says she was em-  
barrassed because she could not  
speak English. "I was so happy  
when I first learned to say  
'thank you very much' that I  
said it on every occasion," she  
said.

Now that she has finished the  
six-month course in home nur-  
sing she is thinking of voluntary  
service in the fall.

"All we want is to be good  
Canadians and to be happy in  
this wonderful country," said  
Mrs. Kindler.

She studied hard at the lan-  
guage and took a course in ac-  
countancy at Ryerson Institute.  
She speaks German and French  
as well as her native Polish. She  
holds a position in one of the  
court offices at city hall.
