was dispatched to end confusion which resulted from 10 earlier directives. The state department has been a target for criticism because of the removal of some books not specifically named in any directives. Senator Joseph McCarthy (Rep. Wis.) assailed particularly the removal "Witness," life story of Whittaker Chambers, avowed reformed Communist.

The first directives for book removals went out in February after McCarthy had declared DEPT. STORE AND IT'S SO SURE! the libraries contained "30,000 Communist books" and said someone has evidently been sabotaging the program.




