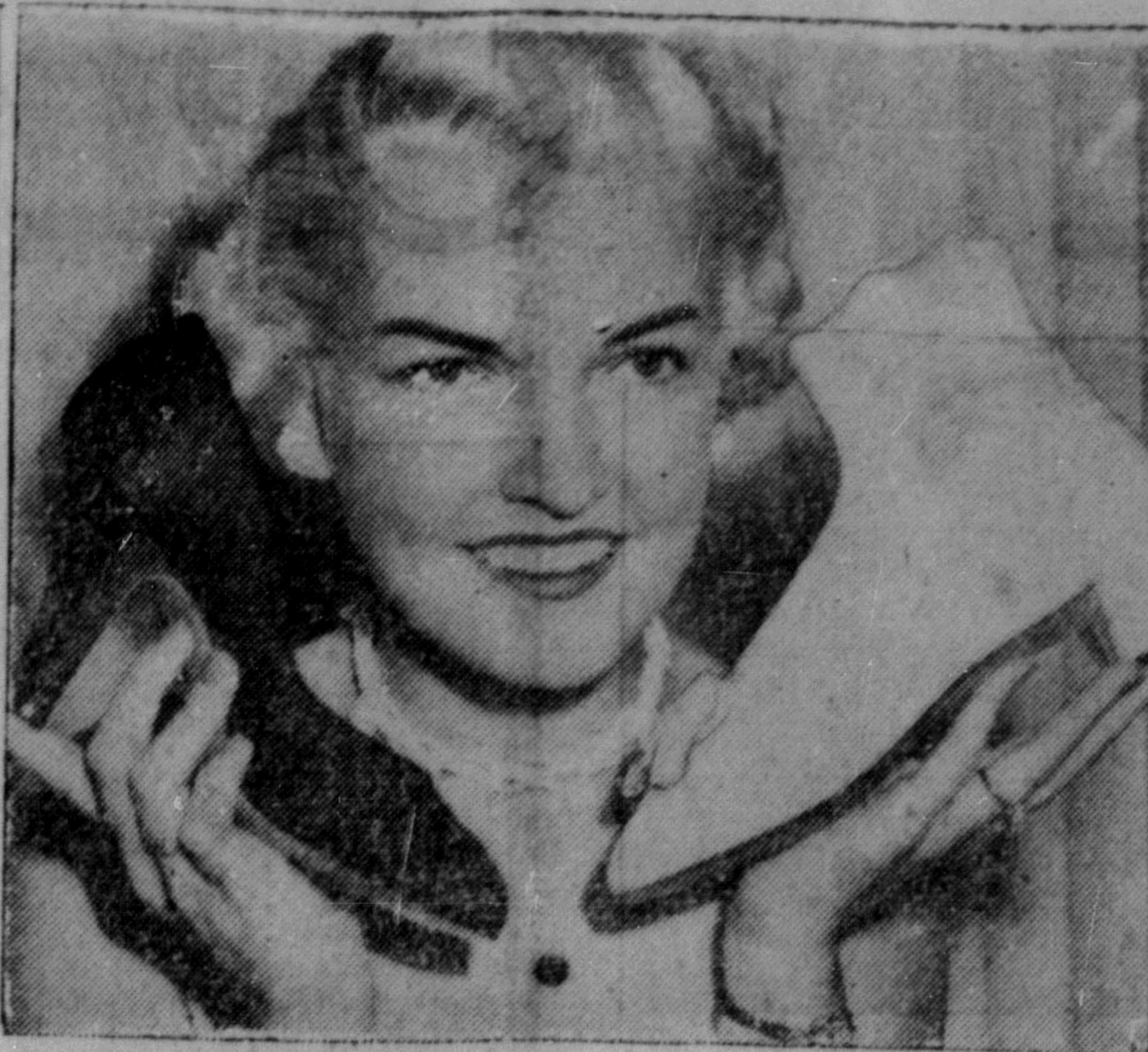

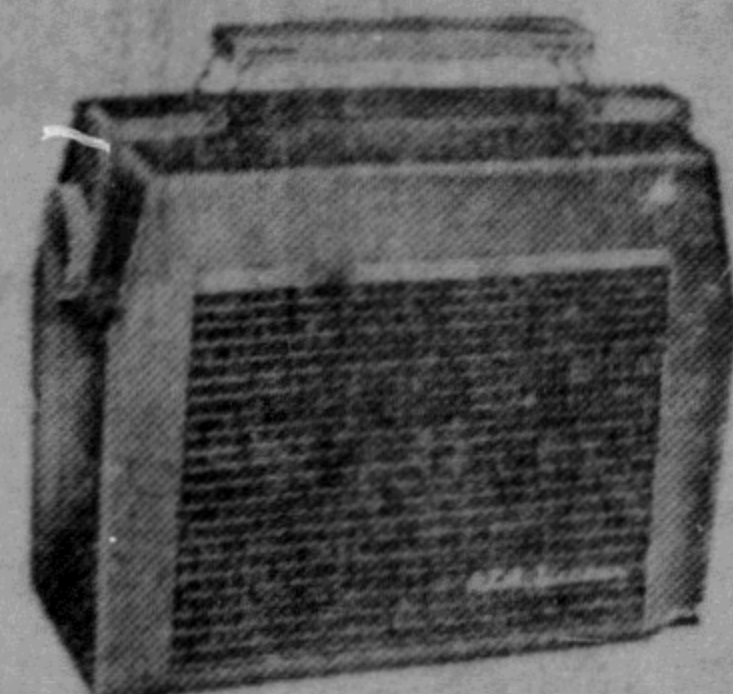

6 to 7 cups green apple slices 3/4 teaspoon cinnamon  
3/4 to 1 cup sugar 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg  
1/2 teaspoon salt 1 tablespoon butter  
Pastry for 2-crust pie  
Combine sugar, salt and spices, sprinkle over green apple slices in a bowl, then toss to mix well. Line a 9-inch pie pan with half of pastry, trim edges but do not prick pastry. Place apple mixture in pan, heaping apples somewhat in centre of pie. Dot with butter. If apples lack tartness add 2 tablespoons lemon juice and a bit of grated rind.  
Bake in hot oven 425F for 40 minutes, or until apples are tender and crust is done.

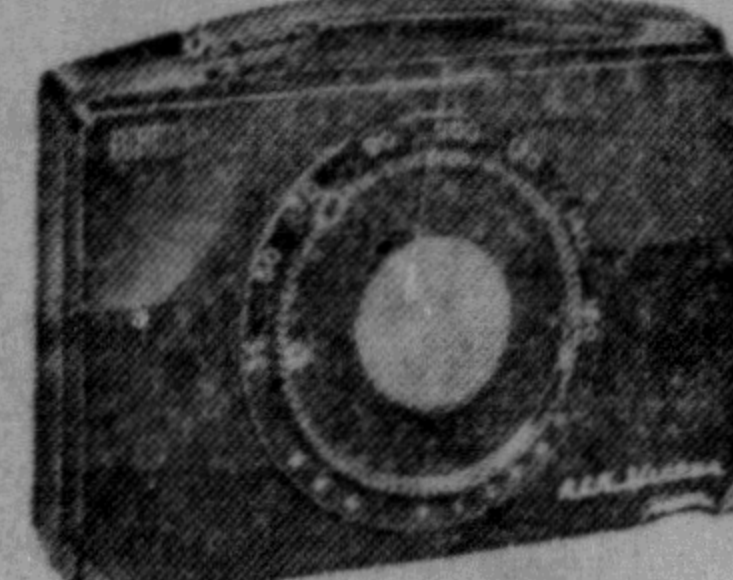

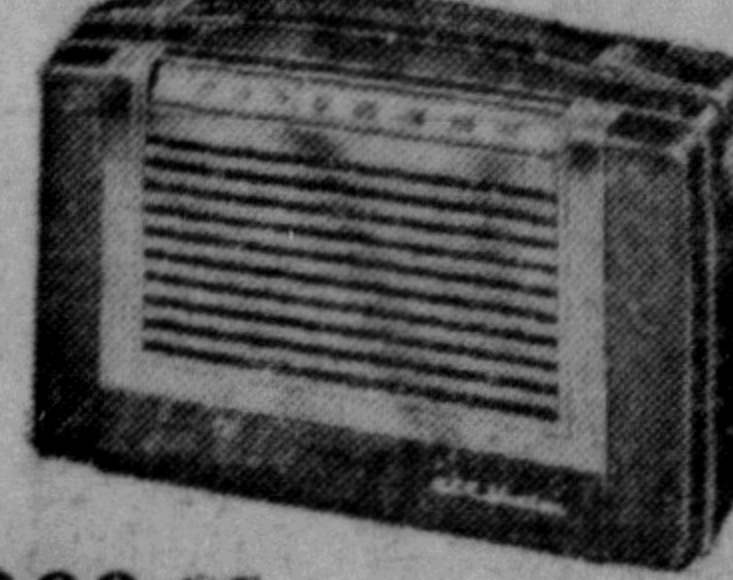
