Expert Can Read Plenty
From A Partner's Bid



Mrs. Keen's bid of two clubs after the double told Mr. Champion several things. First, she didn't have a strong hand or she would have redoubled. Next, she probably had only mediocre support in spades. And finally, she was probably not long in hearts.

In other words, with enough strength to bid two clubs, plus length in hearts, she might have passed on the first round to see if the opponents would get into trouble in the "other major."

It seemed clear to Mr. Champion, then, that the hearts were held by the enemy and that they might outbid him in that suit or find a paying sacrifice spot if permitted to get together at the lower levels. He therefore jumped to four spades. If whatever honor cards Mrs. Keen had happened to fit his hand, four spades might be makeable. If he went down, then it was a good bet the opponents could make four hearts.

Mr. Abel opened the king of hearts and after thinking very briefly Mr. Champion played small from the dummy, losing a heart trick he didn't have to lose.

Mr. Muzzy was watching. "Too bad," he said in mock sympathy, "but don't let it worry you. It can happen to anybody."

"What can?" snapped Mr. Champion.
"Pulling the wrong card," Mr. Muzzy replied.
"Stick around until the end of the hand," said Mr. Champion, "although you probably won't understand it even then."

Mr. Champion's play at trick one was a beautiful and successful try for his contract. Apparently he had to lose a club and three diamonds. But if he could arrange to set up dummy's clubs without letting Mr. Keen in for a diamond lead through the king, he had a chance.

He chose to lose a heart to Mr. Abel rather than a club to Mr. Keen. At trick two Mr. Abel shifted to the six of clubs. Dummy's ace won and the ace of hearts was led on which Mr. Champion ditched his club loser.

He then ruffed a club high, entered dummy with the seven of spades and ruffed another club, setting the suit. Another trump lead to dummy's ten enabled Mr. Champion to cash three good clubs and get rid of all his diamonds.

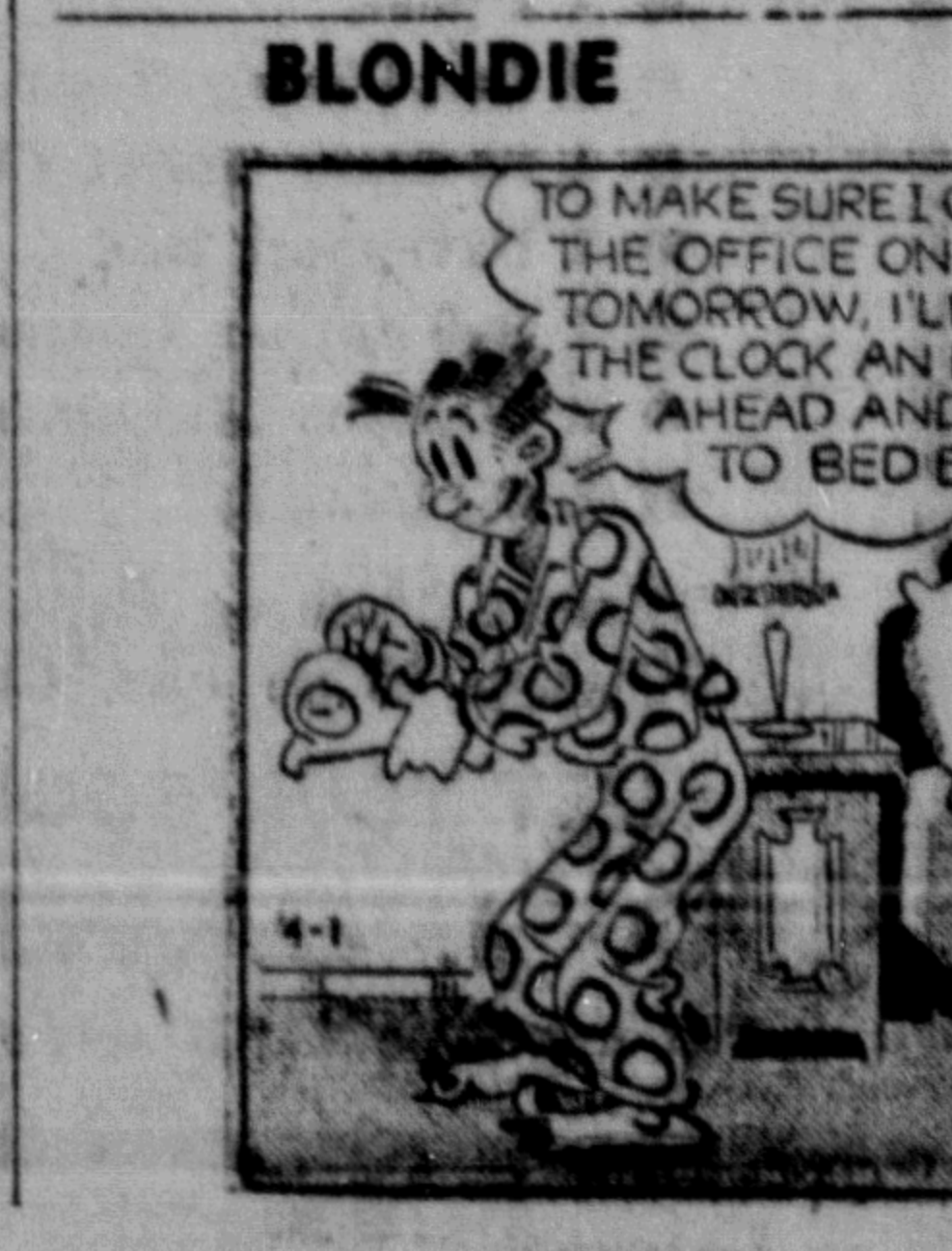
