

Rising Costs Force Paper To Fold up

LONDON (CP) - The weekly Newspaper World, Britain's oldest press and advertising trade journal, has ceased publication.

Patterned along the lines of North America's Editor and Publisher, the periodical was wound up after serving Fleet Street for 55 years.

In a statement issued by the publishers, Benn Brothers Limited, rising production costs and consequent economic difficulties were given as chief reasons for the closure. Simultaneously. it was announced that the staff involved would be retained by the company in production of its other publications.

Passing of Newspaper World. launched in 1898 by the late Charles Baker, prominent journalist of his day, leaves the World's Press News as London's lone trade paper in the publication field.
