He had only one right play and, of course, he made it. Here was his reasoning. First he made a mental check to see if Mr. Dale's opening could be fourth highest from a long suit. Using the rule of 11, he deducted the number of the card led from 11. Seven from 11 leaves four. So there would be four spades higher than the seven outside of Mr. Dale's

But he could see five spades higher than the seven in his own hand and dummy. Therefore, the opening lead was not a fourth highest. It was a top of nothing lead from a holding taken away from him. of three cards or less.

Could it be a singleton? Very unlikely, since that would give Mr. Abel a five-card spade suit from dummy and let it ride. national League season.

The best hope, then, was that Mr. Masters did not play ni ace of spades at trick one. That was the only entry to his hand. He played the nine—the highest trick.




