SPOKANE P-Kaiser Aluminum and Chemical Corp. may construct a water power project in British Columbia to help firm up its supply of electricity during low water periods, a company spokesman said Tuesday.

Norman L. Krey, manager for the company's Northwest operations, said the company has been studying data on available sites and has had discussions with both Canadian authorities and Bonneville Power Administration officials on the subject.

Kaiser engineers will start oreliminary field surveys for a possible water storage dam on lower Arrow Lake, north of Castlegar, within the next few weeks, he said.




