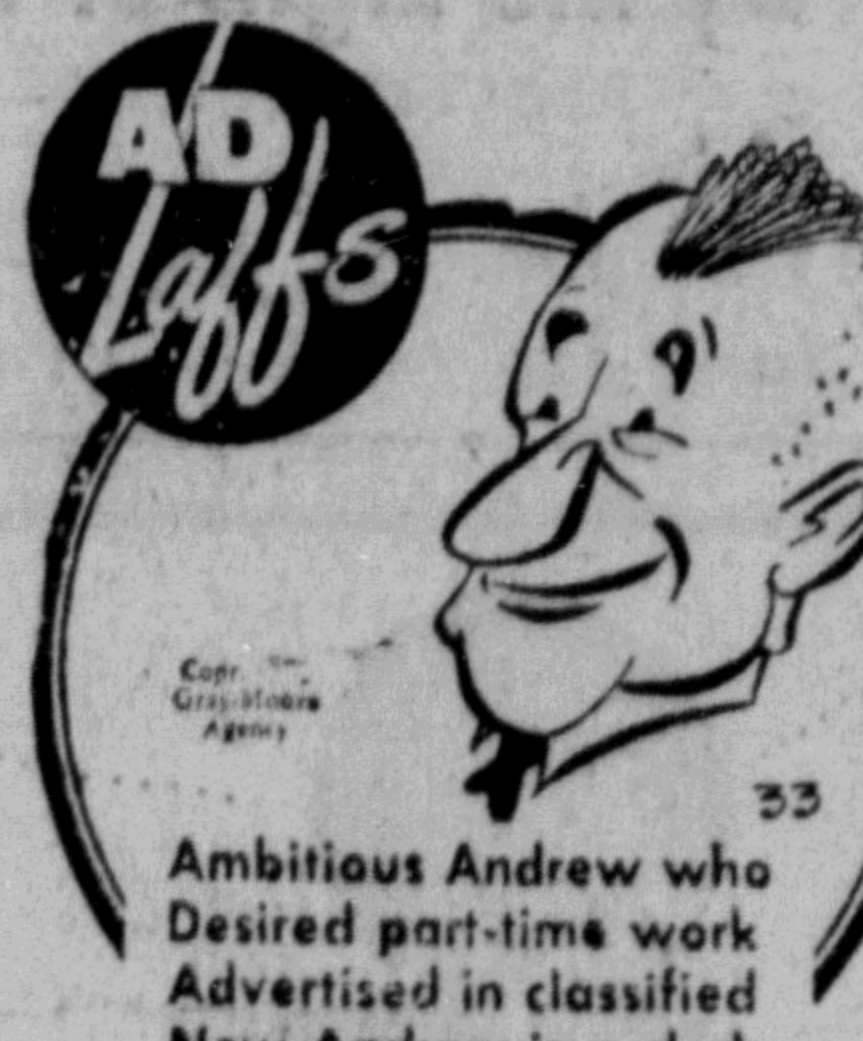

Windsor Has Different View On Coronations

NEW YORK (AP)-The Duke of Windsor said in a radio interview at sea Sunday he doesn't share the feeling of some Americans that Queen Elizabeth's may be the last British Coronation.

The Duke is travelling to Europe aboard the liner United States, which departed last Friday. He was interviewed by another passenger, CBS radio newsman Robert Trout.

The Duke, who will not attend the Coronation, said he thought there were two reasons for the great interest among Americans in the event.

One reason, he said, is that Elizabeth is a young Queen and in America "youth is almost idealized."

The other reason, he said, is that "some in America seem to feel that my niece's Coronation may well be the last."

"I, for one," he added, "do not subscribe to so gloomy a forboding."

David Cohen Embarrassed With Cribs

CHICAGO (AP)-David Cohen found it embarrassing when delivery men began deluging his home with baby cribs.

He's 68 and he has no use for baby cribs.

Cohen found it mystifying when deliveries of baby carriages, of intimate articles of women's clothing and of miscellaneous pieces of furniture arrived in addition to the cribs.

The flood of articles continued for two months. David was spending about half his time returning to Chicago stores the goods which he hadn't bought but which were delivered to him.

The mystery was solved Saturday with the arrest of Mrs. Mary Gulezynski, 24, on a charge of passing worthless cheques-\$15,000 worth of them in the last two months, police reported.

Police said Mrs. Gulezynski would go into a store, make a purchase, offer a cheque made out for more than the cost of the article and ask for the balance in cash. The purchased articles were to go to David Cohen, the women would specify.

Mrs. Gulezynski said she didn't know Cohen. She'd just picked his name from the telephone book.

BLACKWOOD on Bridge

When Things Look Bad, Don't Forget Your Partner

Defending is a part of the game that requires initiative and improvising. Often, in bidding a hand, you can mentally refer to a neat, precise chart on page 142 of that last textbook you read. There you will find your answer. But in defending, you are on your own.

However, there are a number of things to remember which will improve your defense game. In yesterday's column I suggested that you carefully avoid making leads which are likely to give declarer a clear picture of your hand.

Here is another gimmick. When the situation seems hopeless for your side, try to visualize a card or cards which your partner could logically be expected to have and then play him for that holding. Often this will involve making a lead which you would not dream of making in ordinary circumstances. And, as always, you should consider the human angle.

Look at the sensational result Mr. Masters got in today's deal. He took the first two tricks with the king and ace of clubs. It was clear that another club lead would be suicidal. Where were two more tricks coming from? There was probably one to be had in diamonds but certainly none in hearts. And that left the spade suit.

Mr. Masters knows that with nine trumps, missing the queen, Mr. Abel favors laying down the ace and king. In this case, that would mean ruin for the defenders. There were four spades on the board and, for his jump bid in the suit, surely Mr. Abel had at least five.

But what if Mrs. Keen had the jack? Wouldn't a spade lead at trick three be a masterly piece of misdirection? Mr. Masters thought so. He led the six of spades. Mrs. Keen played the jack and Mr. Abel won with the king.

Thinking it over, Mr. Abel figured he had got a good break. Clearly Mrs. Keen had started with Q J 3 in spades. Mr. Masters couldn't have the queen. (Who would be crazy enough to lead away from the queen of trumps?)

So over to the board with the ace of hearts and back with the 10 of spades. Mrs. Keen played the trey and Mr. Abel ducked. Down one.
