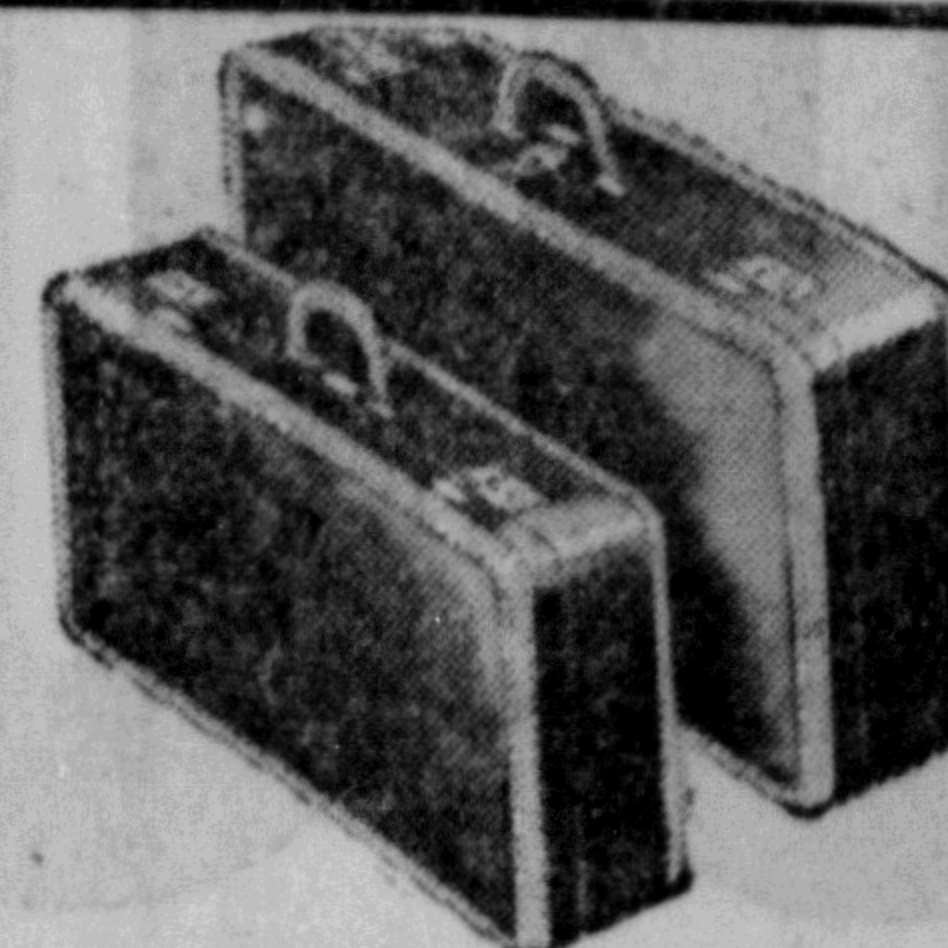
Victoria WIL Team Beset By Finances
