Basically it is a combination of some well-known medical instruments, a couple of extremely sensitive temperature measuring devices and an ultra-high frequency radio transmitter.

The pilot has to be "wired" for radio. He has a couple of wires running outward from metal plates plastered to his skull, three others from the surface of his chest near the heart. and two or more extending from other parts of the body.

#### Soldier Spent Time Coloring Comic Photos

WINNIPEG (CP)\_A Winnipeg man, who spent 27 months with the United States army in Korea, has returned with an odd story of his part in the war.

Technical Sergeant Rodolphe Prefontaine, 26, spent his time turning out colored comics designed to undermine the morale of Communist soldiers.

Prefontaine became a practical student of Oriental phychology, social habits, living condi tions, geography, history and religion effectively to carry out his duties as an amateur car-

The four-color comics are recent development, he said. A more generally used technique is that of the silent cartoon, designed to make its point in pantomime for the 80 per cent of the Chinese Communist army that can't read.

He told of one cartoon that went astray! It showed two cold. shivering soldiers on one side of the paper and on the other side. two more warm and comfortable in front of a fire. The caption, in Korean, indicated that the Communists should come over to the Allied side and warm up.

#### Mathematics Professor FREE! Retiring

MONTREAL (CP)-W. Lloyd G. Williams, professor of mathmematics at McGill University for the last 19 years, is retiring this

Prof. Williams was born at Friendship, Kas., in 1888 and began teaching at 16, following family tradition. His parents both were teachers.

He obtained his BA from Haverford College, Philadelphia; was awarded a Rholes scholarship and attended Merton College, Oxford, where he gained honors in mathematics. He obtained his PhD in mathematics at the University of Chicago.

Prof. Williams began teaching at Miami University, Oxford, Ohio, and came to McGill in 1924. He was instrumental in bringing in the Canadian Mathematical Congress in 1945 and will continue to operate its national office here on retirement.

He says Canada, while lagging behind Britain in the development of mathmatics, is ahead of the United States at the undergraduate level. This was matics as often as those of the United States, despite the disparity in numbers.
