Couple Plan Galapagos Trip To Photo Undersea Monsters

LONDON (Reuters)—Hans and Lotte Haas, Austrian husband-wife team who make their living facing man-eating sharks and other undersea monsters armed only with a camera, are organizing an expedition to the Galapagos Islands.

Haas, bronzed six-footer with a Van Dyke beard, and his tiny blonde wife have taken some of the most amazing undersea pictures the world has seen.

They have bought a 350-ton three-masted schooner for an eight-month trip to the islands, a naturalists' paradise 650 miles west of Ecuador. With them next July will go 10 crew members and eight scientists, including a doctor and a biologist.

Haas, 33, says he is, particularly interested in meeting a ferocious sawfish, often 25-foot long, who rules the roost in the Pacific islands; there is also a large octopus which has never been photographed under water.

The husband-wife team made their reputation — and their money — with a movie called "Red Sea Adventure." It won first prize at the Venice film festival two years ago.

Lotte, one-time Vienna stenographer, operates in a one-piece swimsuit with a glass mask over her face and a cylinder of oxygen strapped to her chest. Twice she has had spells in hospitals—one unappreciative bevil fish clouded her as she tried to photograph the pilot fish that live in the monsters' jaws.

The couple have a theory about sharks—just yell and they go away.

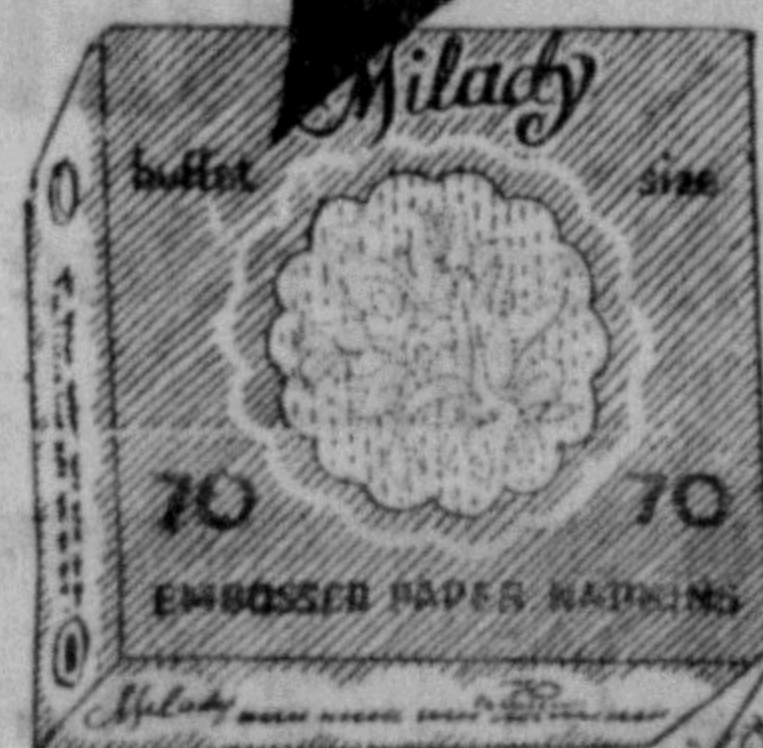
