



# Started as Buck Private

OTTAWA (CP)-A buck private has risen to full general in the Canadian Army.

Charles Foulkes, chairman of the chiefs of general staff, is the fifth to hold that position in the Canadian army. In 31 years he has worked from the lowest to the highest rank. And in mounting the ladder he has become the first Canadian to be appointed a general in peacetime. It is the first among a lot of firsts.

Promotion of the 51-year-old lieutenant-general to genera was announced by Defence Minister Claxton.

The defence minister said in a statement that Gen. Foulkes will continue in his present post and as Canada's military representative to the North Atlantic Treaty Organization.

Gen. Foulkes, who figured prominently in the collapse of the 25th German army in Hoiland in 1945, first donned a uniform in 1923 as a private with a machine-gun battalion in the old non-permanent active miiitia. He rose to captain and in 1926 received a commission as a lieutenant in the Royal Canadian Regiment.

### CAPTAIN TO GENERAL

When the Second World War started he was a captain. As the war progressed he became major, brigadier, major-general and finally lieutenant-general.

"I was the only officer to rise from the rank of captain to lieutenant-general during the last war. I was the youngest officer at 43 to become chief of the general staff. I was the first permanent chairman of the Canadian chiefs of staff and now I am the first Canadian to be appointed a general in peace-

"I am, of course, very pleased. It is one of those things a person

The first Canadians appointed general in the Canadian Army were Sir William D. Otter of Toronto, after the Boer War, and World War.

Gen. A. G. L. McNaughton, now chairman of the International Joint Commission, was promoted to general in 1942 while serving as head of the first Canadian Army overseas. The fourth was Gen. H. D. G. Crerar, retired, in 1944. He also served as commander of Canadian forces overseas during the Second World War.
