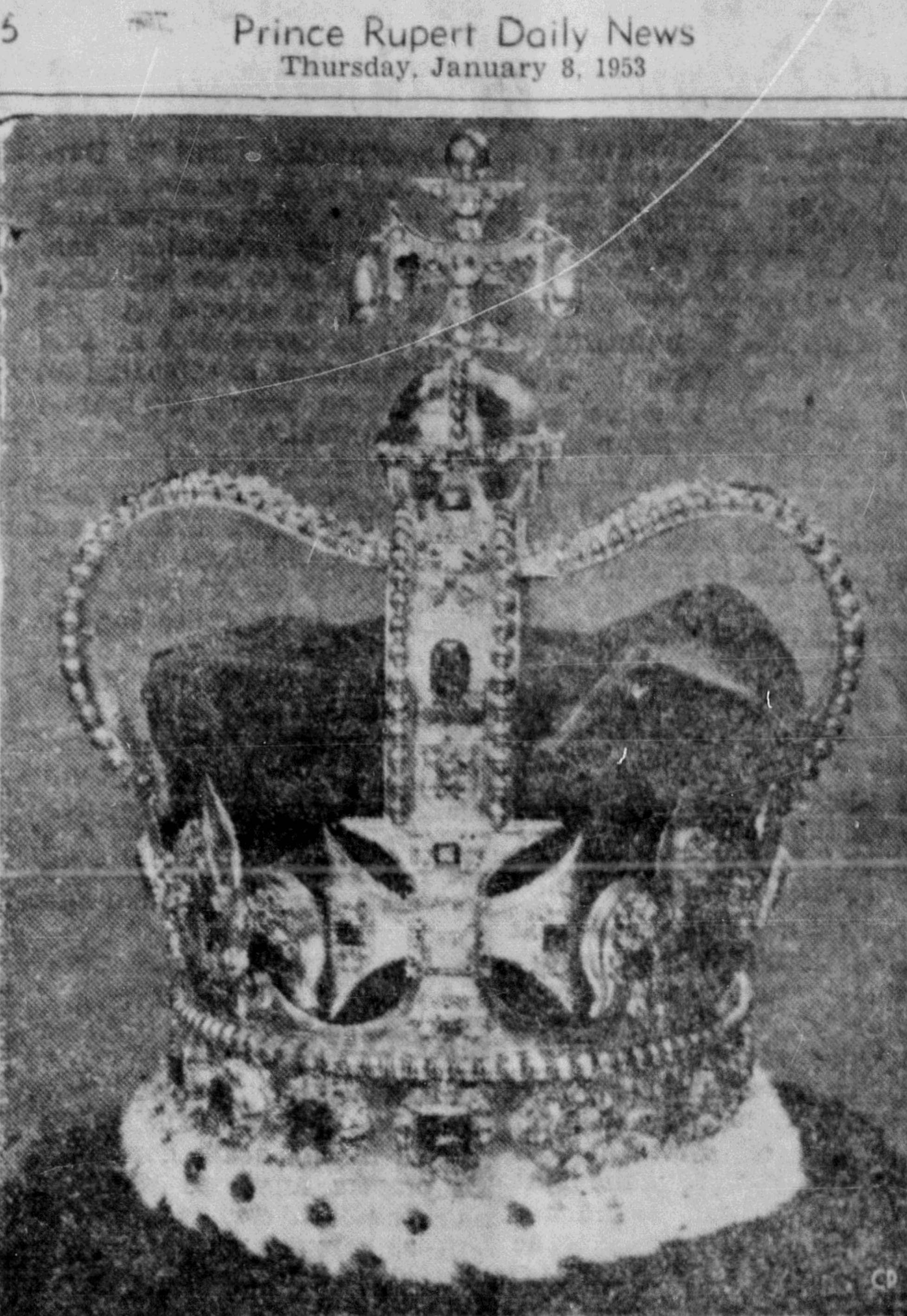

## Youthful Globetrotter Walks Across Europe

CALGARY (CP)—John Calverley thinks that Canadians in general are not well informed about their own country.

The 21-year-old globe-trotter who has walked across Europe and Canada also said that people in this country "rarely speak of anything but their occupations."

He feels they lack interest in other parts of the country and his remedy is travel. He has an opinion on that, too.

"If you want to travel, then travel at a walk," he told a reporter.

EUROPEAN JAUNT

The Oakville, Ont., youth left his home early this year and went to England. From there he went to Greece via France, Italy, Switzerland and Yugoslavia.

As he hitch-hiked across Europe, he was constantly amazed at the interest in Canada.

"Wherever I went they asked questions about the country—intelligent questions that I couldn't always answer," he said.

"They wanted to know what system of government we had. They wanted to find out the country's industrial potential and inquired about fishing on the west and east coasts."

Calverley answered as many questions as he could but he decided that when he returned to Canada he would find the answers.

WORKED FOR BBC

After 2 1/2 months in Greece making motion pictures and sound recording of Byzantine culture for the BBC, he travelled to Halifax and started the trek across Canada.

When he tired of "hitching," he would stop in a village or town that appealed to him, work for a while, study the customs of the people and then hit the road again.

To date, Calverley has travelled from Halifax to Vancouver and back to Calgary again.

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## MacMillan Hits Taxation On Forestry

VANCOUVER (CP)—H. R. MacMillan said Tuesday the \$13,800,000 net profit earned by MacMillan and Bloedel Ltd. in 1952 was "no more than the company should earn."

Addressing the shareholders annual meeting, Mr. MacMillan, chairman of the board, said if the company headquartered in a "larger community" its earnings would be accepted as a normal experience.

He was criticizing the British Columbia government reported plans to increase taxation on forest industries.

Mr. MacMillan said the government should spread its taxation over "all natural resources and sources" and not just the forest industry when it is looking for greater taxation revenues.
