At this lack of interest in holding for this reason—Prince Rupert is not a people are turning to the ever-increasing number of meetings.

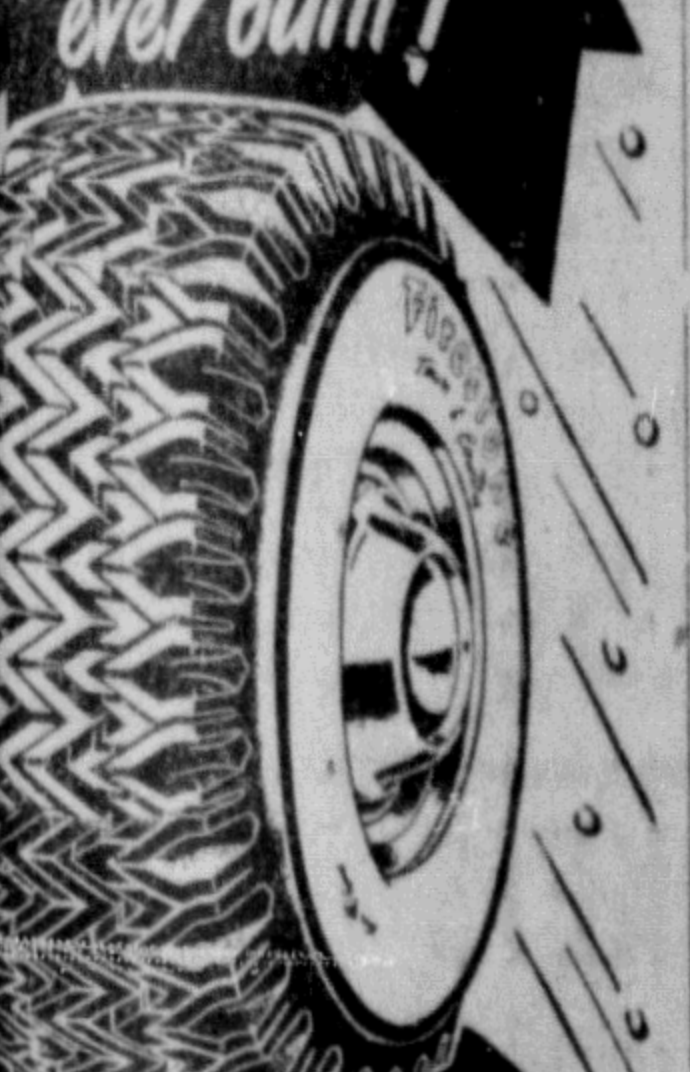

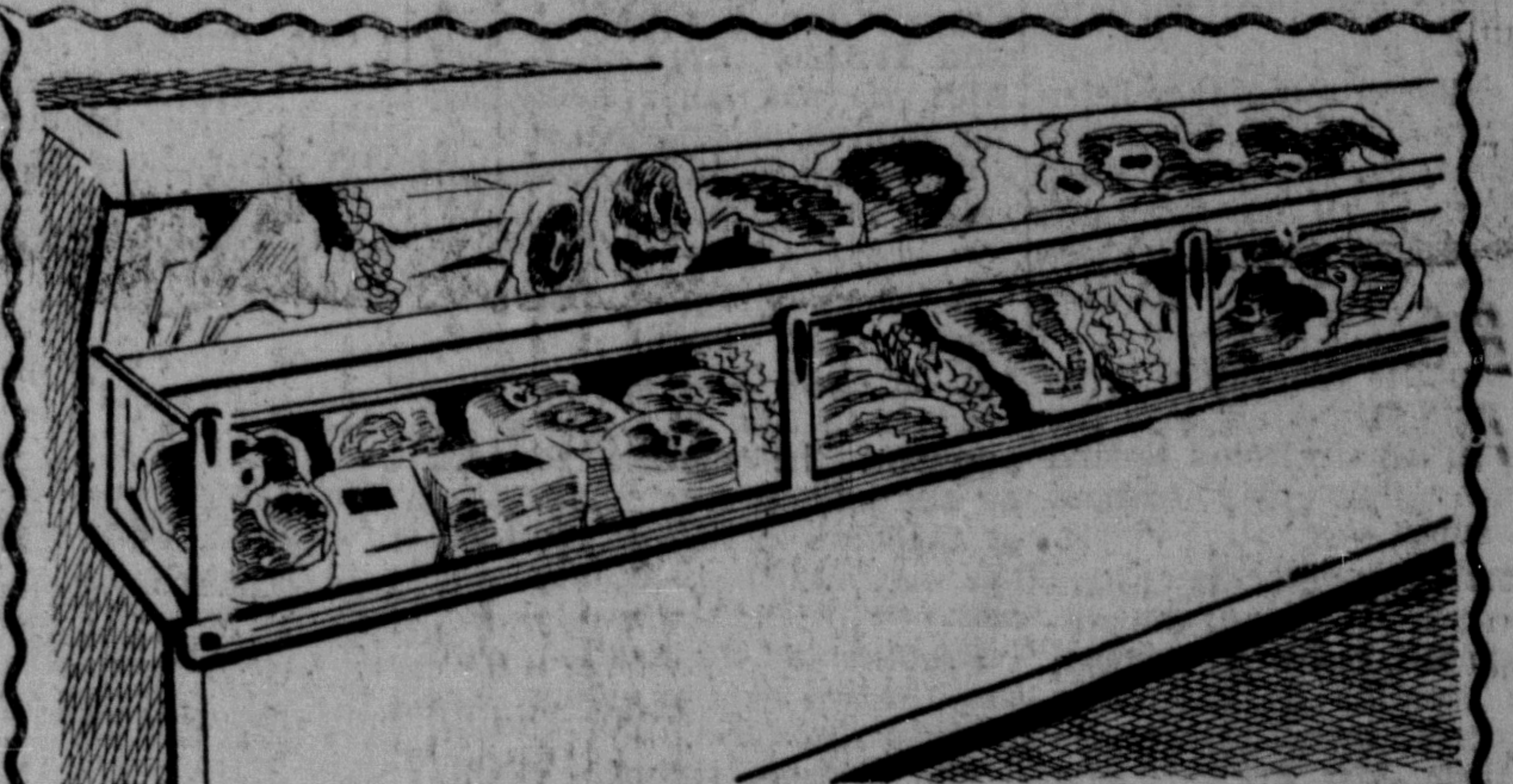
