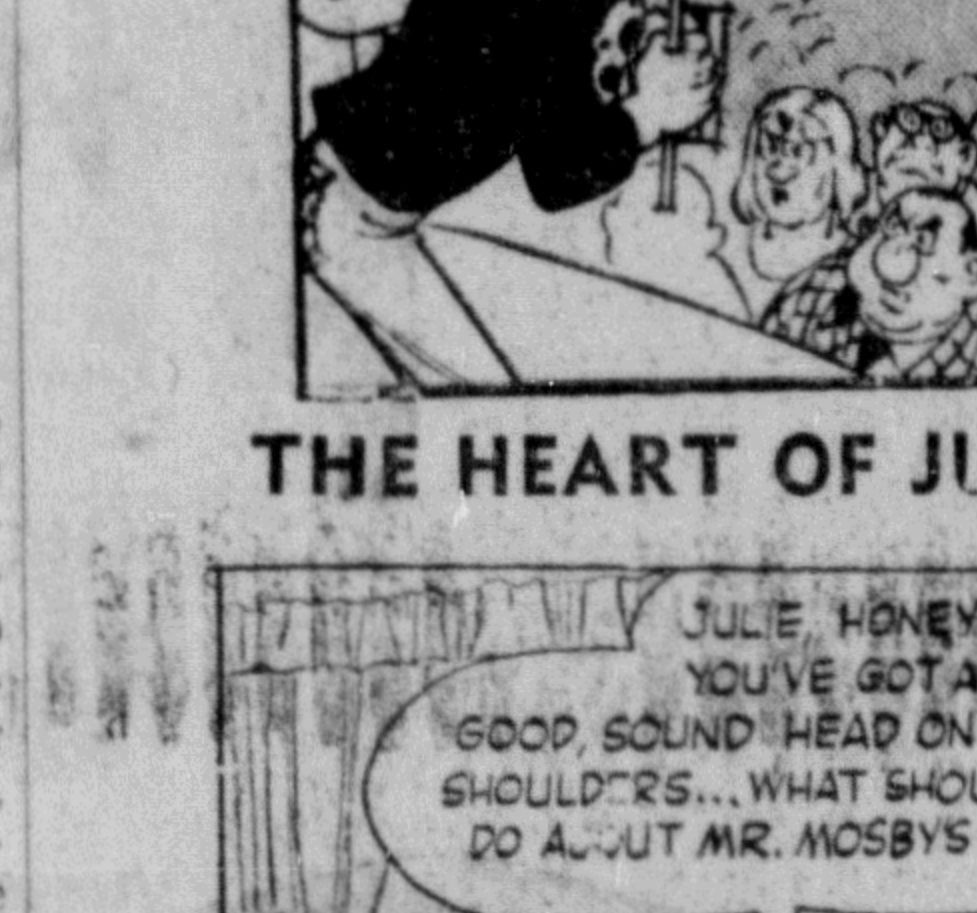
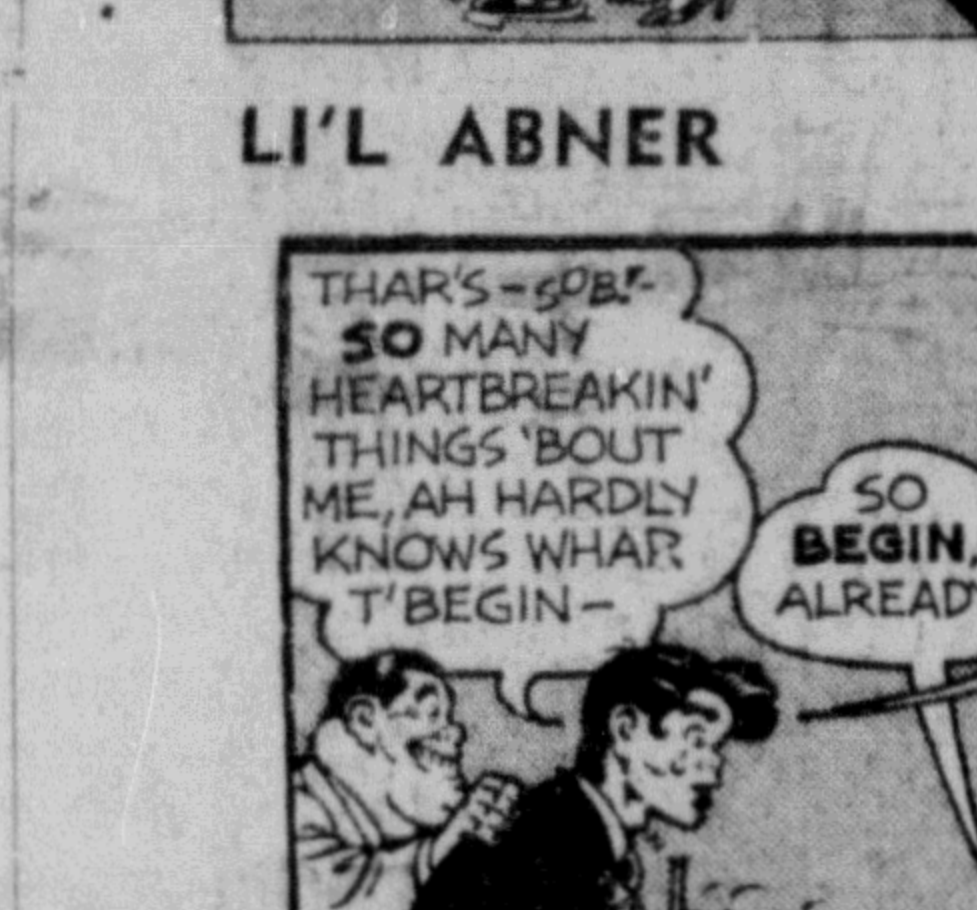

Hospital Blood Bank Lauded
 As One Benefit of Red Cross

The Red Cross fund campaign committee in an appeal for support of their one-night drive scheduled for March 19, today pointed to the hospital blood bank as a direct return on the public's investment.

Dave Radford, local Red Cross president, said that while no Red Cross blood donor clinics have been held in Prince Rupert for the past two years, the Prince Rupert General Hospital along with Terrace, Hazelton and Smithers hospitals, still receive whole blood plasma from the Red Cross blood bank, for emergency use.

Hospital authorities reported that, during 1953, a total of 453 pints of whole blood, plus 37 pints of dry plasma were received here from the Red Cross. Some of that was shipped from here to Terrace, Hazelton and Smithers, which have no facilities for storing their own blood supply.

The Prince Rupert hospital also collects blood from local donors when the Red Cross bank

here runs low, but the majority of the blood supply comes from the Red Cross in Vancouver.

Mr. Radford stressed that "your contributions to the local Red Cross fund drive March 19, will help to keep the vital blood supply coming in."

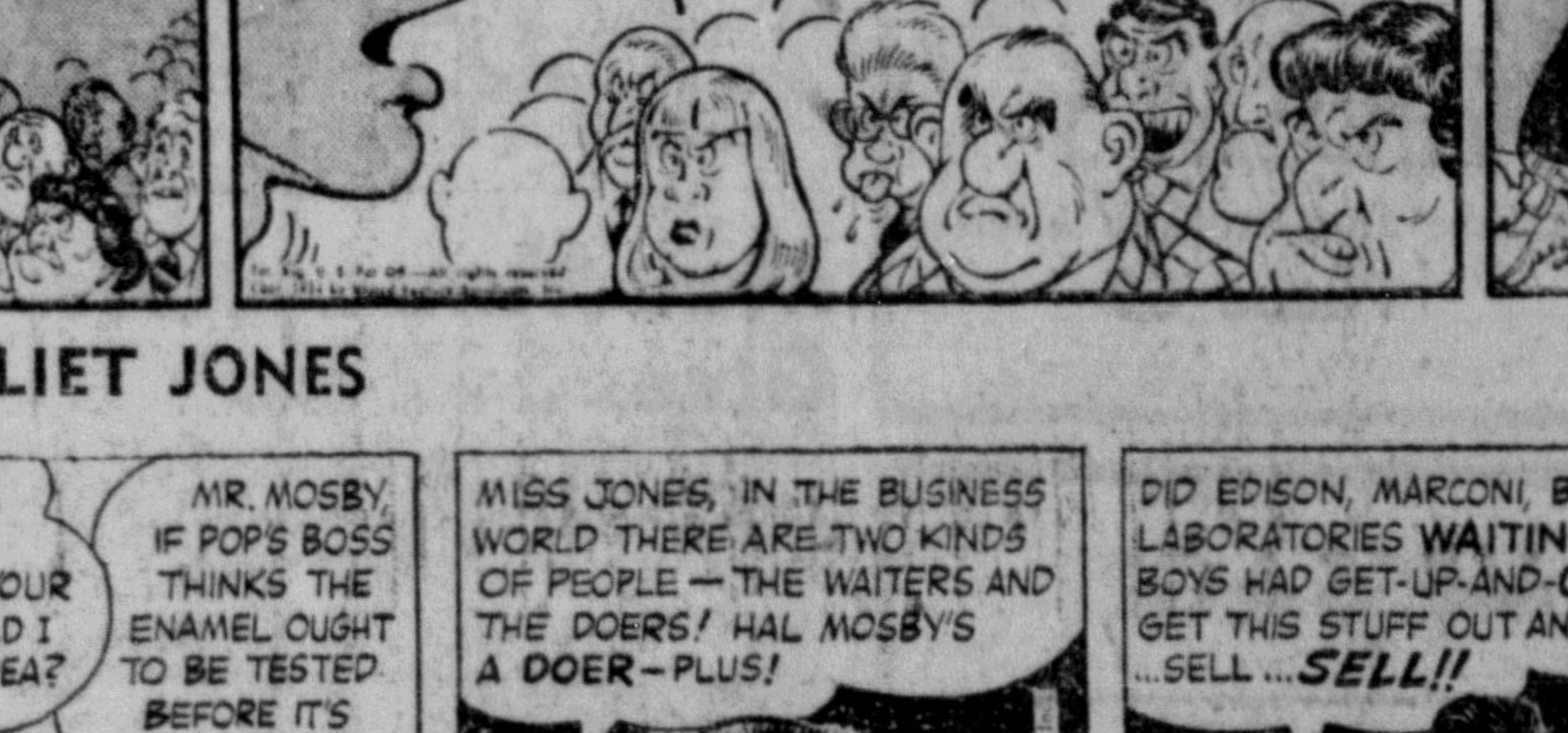
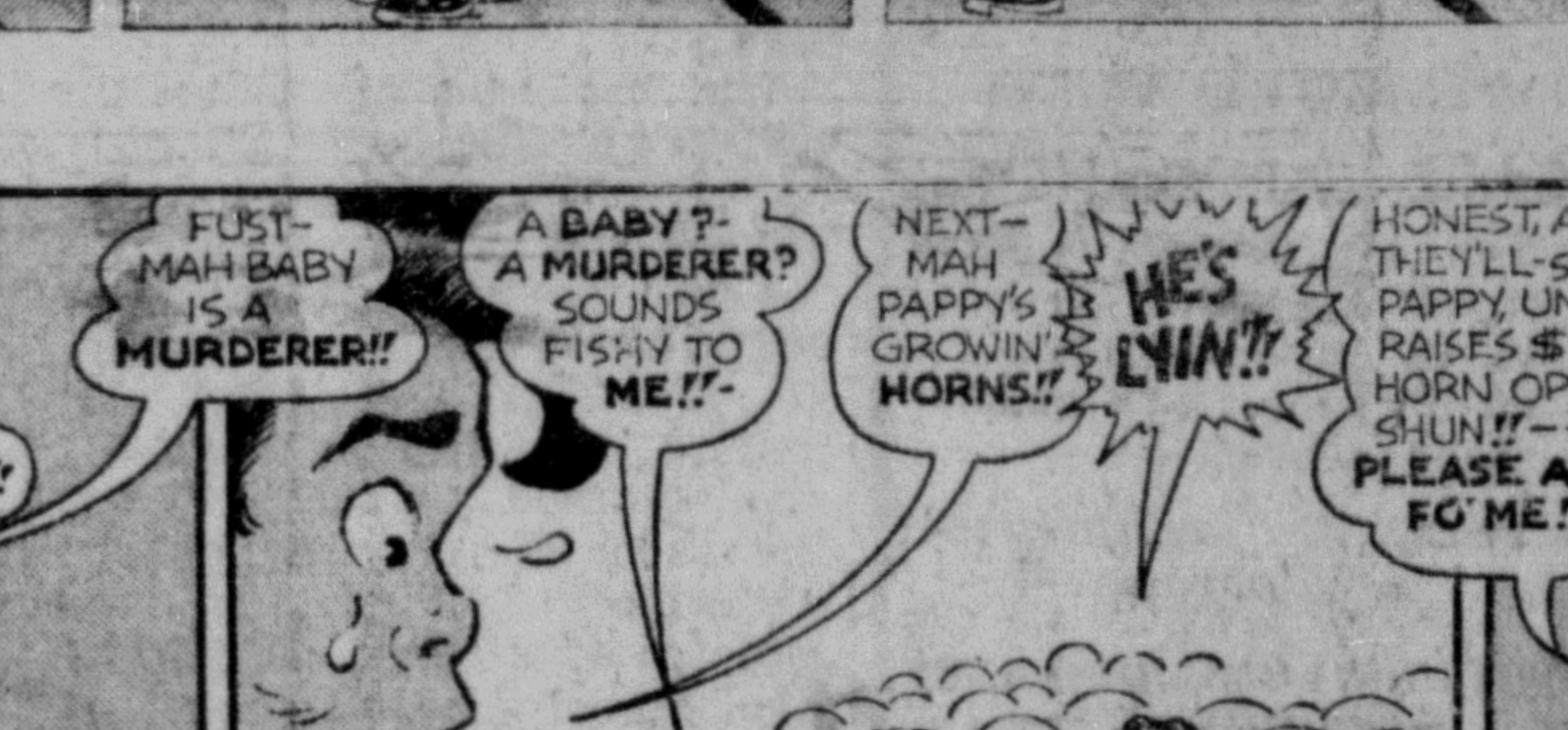
