

## Civic Centre Operation Shows \$10,000 Deficit

In spite of a poor financial showing last year, Dr. R. G. Large, retiring president of the Civic Centre Association, saw definite reasons for encouragement in his report to the organization's annual meeting last night.

Looking on the brighter side, the Centre has continued to play an important part in supplying the recreational, educational and cultural needs of the community. Dr. Large said in his report. Such annual affairs as the University Extension Music and Drama Festival and arts and crafts courses were carried out with enthusiasm and success.

For the first year the Alaska Trail has received sufficient support to make it a financial success. This is due in large measure to the efforts of the newly formed auxiliary.

A well organized city-wide drive for new members was conducted with the encouraging result that we have well over 2,000 members this year and should reach 2,400. A new maple floor was laid in the auditorium and have instituted roller skating. This is proving popular with old and young alike, and will see in our budget for 1953 that we anticipate a substantial revenue from this source.

In expressing appreciation of the work done by Fred Jones as general secretary, Dr. Large said the atmosphere of the Centre reflects his enthusiasm and with the other members of the staff, Mr. Miles, Mr. and Mrs. Svendsen, Mrs. Parent and Mr. McIntosh, we have the confidence of the executive and, I am sure, of the membership as a whole.

The president also acknowledged as a "great asset to our organization" the automatic illuminated scoreboard for basketball donated by Ormes Drugs, North Star Bottling Works and Swenson & Anderson.

At a meeting of the board of directors which followed the general session, W. F. Stone, vice-president, was elected president for 1953. Other officers elected to the executive council were: vice-president, George Viereck; honorary secretary, Miss H. Silversides; treasurer, E. D. Forward; directors, T. N. Youngs, A. F. Crawley, Mrs. W. D. Smith, Fred Calderoni, Dr. G. D. Galbraith and J. F. Major.

Members-at-large elected by the association were W. Lambie, Percy Moore, Mr. Stone and Mr. Major.

Having gone through what Dr. Large described as a "truly disastrous year" in a monetary sense, the association agreed upon appointment of a special committee to investigate possibilities of raising additional revenue.

It was decided the committee should have an unlimited field of inquiry, including examination of a proposal that the Centre undertake construction of a skating rink.
