BLACKWOOD on BRIDGE

 Play Forces Defender To Lead Your Suit

To force a defender to lead a suit to your advantage it is often necessary to remove from his hand all cards in the other suits. This is known as the elimination or strip play.

In today's deal Mrs. Keen led the jack of clubs against the six no trump contract. Miss Brash could see only eleven tricks in quick winners and three possible chances for a twelfth trick.
 There was the chance the clubs would break 3-3 which was rather remote after Mrs. Keen chose to open the suit. Next, there was the chance of a successful finesse of the queen of hearts. And last was the chance of a throw-in play. Miss Brash played in such a way as to keep all three chances alive.
 She won the first trick in her own hand with the ace of clubs. She cashed four spade tricks, discarding one of dummy's small hearts. On the third spade Mrs. Keen dropped the deuce of hearts, trying to coax an early finesse in that suit. On the fourth spade she let go the deuce of diamonds.
 Next, Miss Brash cashed three diamonds. On the third round Mrs. Keen had to discard again and this time she chose a small club.
 Now the king and queen of clubs were played, getting everybody down to three cards. It was clear that Mrs. Keen had left the 10 of clubs and two hearts. Another club lead put her in and she had to lead a heart into Miss Brash's ace-queen.

The way Mrs. Keen played her cards the end-play could not possibly go wrong. But it is not always a cinch. For example, suppose Mrs. Keen had discarded a second small heart instead of a club on the run of the other suits. In that case, Miss Brash could not throw her in with a club because it would be clear that she could cash two club tricks. Miss Brash might have gone for the finesse of the queen of hearts, losing to the lone king.
