man in the parade. Into such select and long-established company as Howe, Ted Lindsay and Red Kelly has come a sprightly young rookie, Earl (Dutch) Reibel. The youngster has matched Howe's six points, but the NHL scoring champ ranks first because he has two goals along with four assists. The new centre man of the Detroit production line has made his contribution entirely with assists—six of them.

Kelly, the Red Wings' high-scoring defenceman, and Lindsay have counted two goals and two assists apiece for four points. Bert Olmstead of Montreal Canadiens is tied with them with his four assists.

## TOPS IN GOALS

The man currently with the most goals is Montreal's ace sniper, Maurice Richard, with three goals. His NHL-career total now stands at 350, a record broken just as often as Monsieur Richard bags himself a goal.

Tied with Richard at three points in the early-season play are rookie Ike Hildebrand of New York Rangers, Tod Sloan of Toronto Maple Leafs and defenceman Bill Gadsby of Chicago Black Hawks.

All the leaders have appeared in three games except Hildebrand and Sloan, whose teams have been in only two games.
