OTTAWA (P)-When the department of agriculture, consumer section, starts recommending "that old fashioned favorite wilted lettuce" - it's

Six slices chopped bacon; one hair cup chopped onion; onethird to one-half cup vinegar; 1 teaspoon sugar optional; 10 cups leaf lettuce, 2 quarts, broken into large pieces; salt and pepper to taste.

Cook the chopped bacon until it is crisp and brown. Add chopped onion to hot fat and saute the onion until it turns yellow. · Now add one-third to one-half cup vinegar, depending on how tangy you like it and add the

When the vinegar is heated, to show that she possesses an add half lettuce, cover pan and cook until the lettuce is just wilted, but no longer.


