

Giant Meat Surplus Nearly All Sold

OTTAWA (CP)—The Canadian government may soon get out of the meat-selling business, and officials hope it can stay out.

With sale of 8,000,000 pounds of carcass beef to Britain at fire-sale prices, the government has less than 20,000,000 pounds of canned pork left in its larder.

The plan is to call for tenders

by Jan. 25 for disposal of remaining stocks, possibly through international brokers who may sell or barter them in some overseas country.

The government will accept the best tender and the outlook is that by February, it will be completely out of meat.

Thus over a two-year period

the government will have purchased and disposed of almost 200,000,000 pounds of surplus beef and pork, taken up to support the market following the outbreak of foot-and-mouth disease in 1952.

The United States market, closed to Canadian meat, the government was forced to sell at a loss. When final sales are made, the loss likely will total more than \$50,000,000—chalked up as part of the cost of fighting the disease.

U.S. To Spend Extra Billion On Fast Interceptor Planes

WASHINGTON (AP)—When the United States spends an extra billion next fiscal year on continental defence, it will mostly be buying fast interceptor planes

intended to seek out and hit any attacking bombers.

Officials say the interceptor program, which includes purchases of the new F-102, super-sonic, almost automatic bomber hunter, will account for most of the increase.

The chain of radar warning installations along the northern perimeter of North America, they claim, is largely provided for by left-over funds of earlier years.

Canada also participates in the northern radar set-up, and the RCAF is concentrating on fighter production and training.

President Eisenhower mentioned the billion-dollar spending increase for continental defence in his State of the Union message Jan. 7 when he touched on his new military program.

WINS OPPOSITION SUPPORT

That program, leaning heavily on power to deliver a shattering counter-blow to any aggressor, apparently is winning strong Democratic support in the U.S. Congress. There were reports that Democratic leaders are advising their colleagues to tone down criticism of foreign military policies of the administration and that last year's cuts in air force appropriations may fade as a partisan issue.

Present U.S. deliveries of military aircraft, ordered months ago, are running about 1,000 a month.

U.S. Destroyer Aids Stricken Canadian Sailor

HONG KONG (CP)—A critically ill Canadian seaman arrived today aboard the United States destroyer Knapp after a 450-mile dash from the middle of the China Sea.

The sailor, Vernon Moffat, 55, oiler aboard the 9,824-ton Canadian Pacific motorship Maplecove, was transferred to the U.S. destroyer after he was stricken during a voyage from Hong Kong to Japan.

Moffat was given medical aid by the destroyer's doctor, Lieut. Robert Monaco. He was taken to Queen Mary Hospital on arrival here.

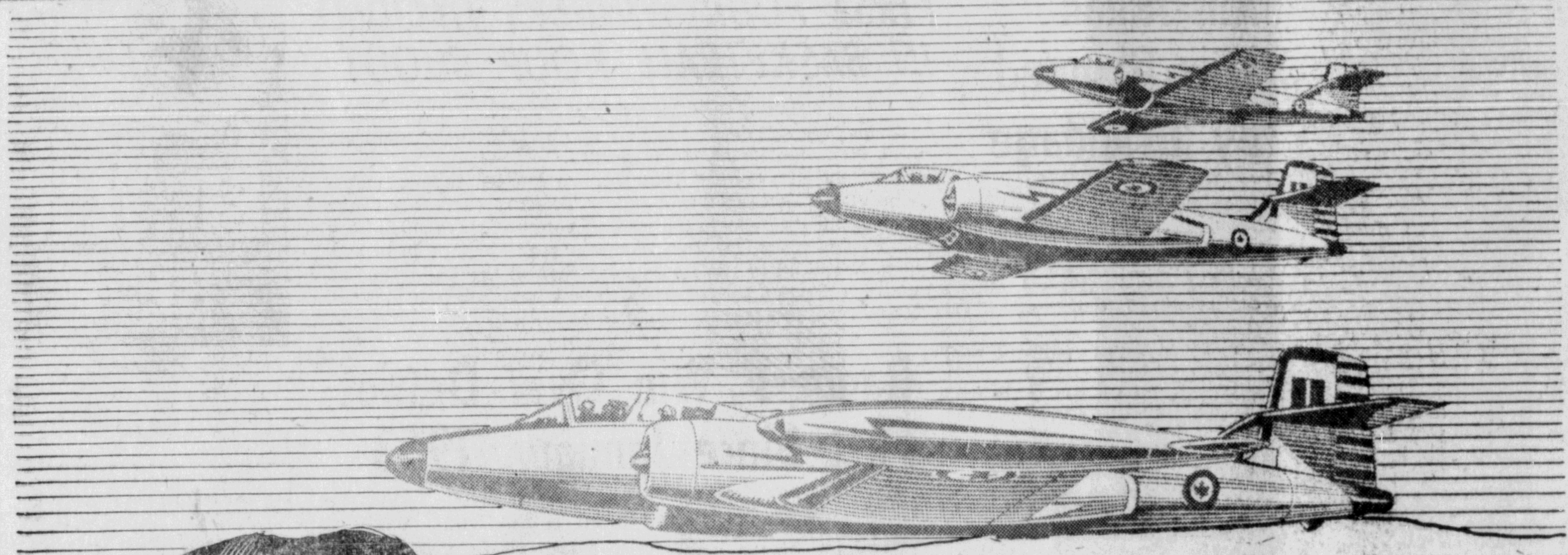
