Shrewd Defence Beats Unbeatable Contract

The test of a fine defender lies in his ability to find ways to beat unbeatable contracts. If that is contradictory, see how wily old Mr. Dale defied today's hand.

Opening lead was the jack of diamonds and Mr. Abel properly followed low from dummy and his own hand with the queen. Survey of his prospects led him to bring in the king. So he led to the king, returned a small card and finessed the jack. Dale won with the queen. And there was no way to trump by straight play. As you see, he was right. Mr. Abel had four trumps, three diamonds, and already won and the hearts if Mr. Dale cashed the ace of spades, dummy's would furnish an extra trick.

Dale realized the ace of spades would be a give-up, actual return was the spades.

It is easy to say that the ace should be played from dummy. But remember that it could see only his own and dummy. His first trick was to put up the ace. But suppose Mrs. Keen had with the ace and the spades. In that case, the play was to duck so the ace would block the third round.

Abel had a tough guess. He guessed wrong. He ducked the ace, dropping it and setting up two tricks in the suit—enough to win the contract.

When Mr. Abel should have put himself in this position, he should have played the ace differently, leading first and following with the diamond, hoping to duck the lead into Mrs. Keen's hand. You see, his reward for perfect play would have been full of the queen. Then he had made an easy 10.

SCHOOL DAY LUNCHEONS FOR HUNGRY CHILDREN

to salmon mixture, season. Shape 6 thin salmon cakes and brown quickly in butter. Split large buns and place hot salmon cakes between. Serve with dill pickles.

SALMON OMELET

½ lb. can salmon
4 eggs
Nutmeg
Salt, pepper
4 tbsps. boiling water

Beat eggs light (the whites separately), add salmon minced and strained, seasoning, and lastly hot water. Put in well buttered omelet pan, cook until firm. Serve with toast.
