

More Money To Be Sought By Bennett

VICTORIA (C)—Premier W. A. C. Bennett expects to take the British Columbia government's case for better financial returns for the province from the federal government to Ottawa in the fall.

Premier Bennett told a press conference here he will soon discuss Dominion-provincial relations with Carl Goldenberg of Montreal, economic counsel who is preparing B.C.'s brief.

Mr. Bennett left Sunday to attend the national Social Credit conference in Toronto June 26 and 27 but he does not feel this is the time to approach Ottawa. At any rate, he said, Mr. Goldenberg has not finished preparing B.C.'s submission.

"We don't think the climate is ripe in the heat of an election campaign," Mr. Bennett said.

"After the election we expect there will be a government in Ottawa more favorably disposed to better treatment of provincial governments."

Finance Minister Einar Gunderson and Mr. Bennett will discuss B.C.'s case with Mr. Goldenberg who is expected to meet them in Toronto.

The conference will be attended by the national Social Credit leader Solon Low and Alberta's Premier Ernest Manning. The Social Credit federal election platform will be drafted there.

Premier Bennett will take some ideas of his own to the conference. They include:

Immediate reduction of interest rates; lower down payment for home builders with material reduction in interest rates; immediate reduction in personal income taxes, single person's \$2,000, married person's \$3,000 and exemption of \$750 for each child; the Canadian dollar to be kept below the American dollar to assist the sale abroad of Canada's basic export commodities such as wheat, cattle and lumber; federal participation in all main highways and greatly expanded construction.

Premier Bennett outlined these proposals in a telegram to Saskatchewan retail merchants in Fort Qu'Appelle, where he was scheduled to make an address Tuesday but had to decline the invitation due to developments in B.C.

Summerland Girl Dies From Polio

VICTORIA (C)—An 11-year-old Summerland girl has died of polio, bringing total fatalities this year to four, the provincial health department reported Friday.

A total of 51 cases have been reported to date. This compares with 16 cases and no fatalities at this time in 1952.

FAVERSHAM, England (CP)—The 22 women who play a soccer match at the annual Faversham carnival have protested against plans to replace them this year with a baseball game between United States Army teams. The women said local talent should be used and that few Britons understand baseball.

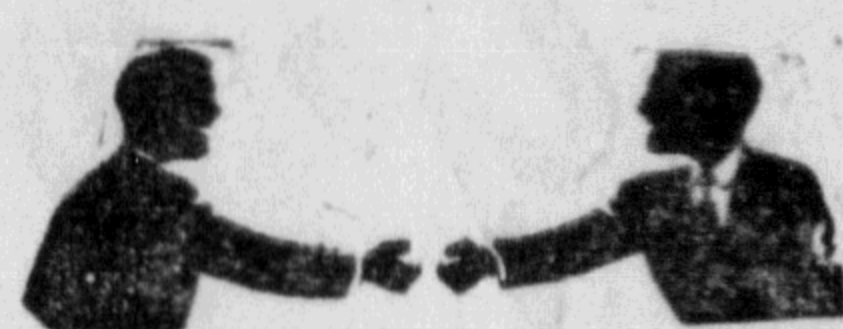

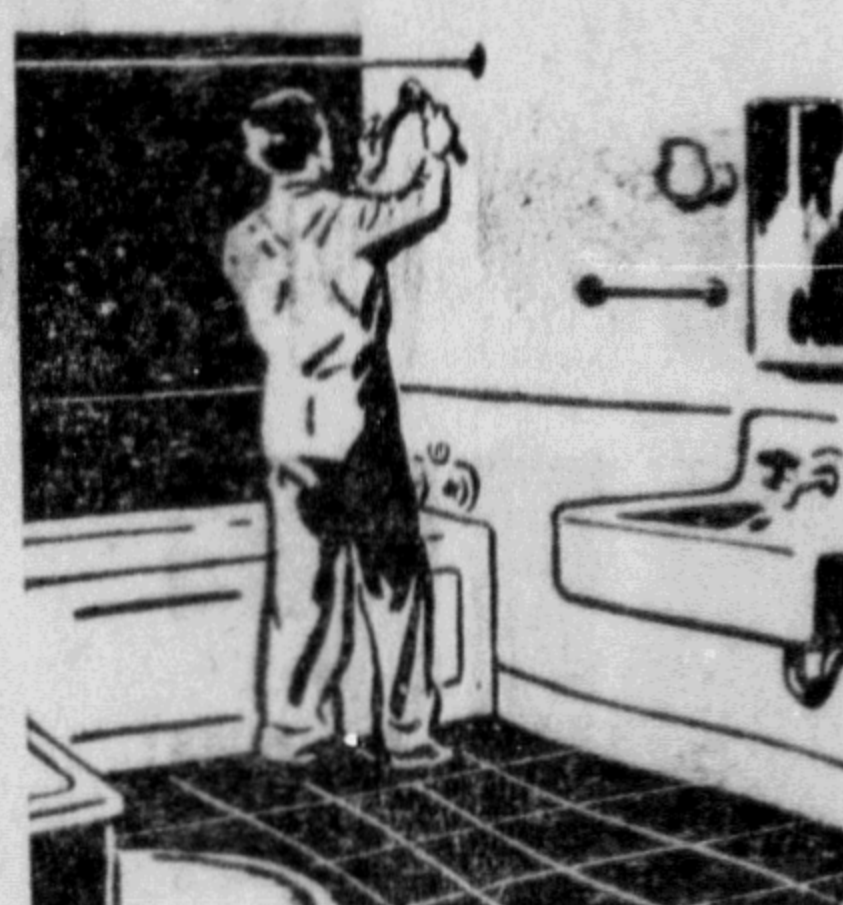
