## Commercials Down Esquires 11-10 In Free-Hitting Ball Game Sunday

Commercials edged Esquires 11-10 Sunday in a free-hitting baseball game marred by 10 errors for the losers, accounting for six unearned runs.

By no means a pitchers' duel—the contest provided 15 hits for Esquires and 11 for the hotelmen—the game was lost in the last three innings when Jack Sharpe took the mound over for the losers from Dick Letourneau in the seventh frame.

Letourneau, recently returned from a semi-pro stint with the New Westminster Royals, was ahead 10-9 when Sharpe was sent in to pinch-hit. Commercial tied, then edged Esquires' score with four telling hits off Sharpe. Letourneau allowed seven hits.

Winning pitcher Gord Cameron was belted for 15 hits but

more than half of the balance of batters to face him struck out.

Other "new" faces on the diamond this season were those of Cliff Dahl and Jack Lindsay, both strengthening the weakened Esquires. Dahl hit two for four—one a double—and drove in three runs; Lindsay hit two for four, with one rbi.

High man on the batting lineup was Commercial catcher Herb Morgan who hit four for five times at the plate—one a triple—and drove in four runs.

Hawryluk proved the big gun for Esquires bringing in four runs. He hit two for four.

#### Facing Dangerous Player Needs Thinking as He Does

In making an avoidance play (keeping a "dangerous" opponent out of the lead) it is necessary to think of every possible countermeasure the defenders might employ to thwart your plans. This is particularly true when you are playing against a fine defender like Mr. Champion.

In today's deal Mr. Dale won the first two tricks with the king and queen of hearts. He continued with the ace of hearts and Mr. Abel ruffed.

Now Mr. Abel had a plan and a very good plan, as far as it went. He correctly decided that it was of vital importance to keep Mr. Champion out of the lead so that a diamond could not be led through his ace-queen.

He cashed the ace and king of clubs and ruffed a club in dummy. He ruffed dummy's last heart. Next, he took two rounds of spades, ending on the board. At this point he was feeling very well satisfied with himself. Trumps had broken 2-2, which was necessary to the success of his plan. All he had to do now was to duck a diamond lead around to Mr. Dale and the old boy would be end-played.

So out came a small diamond from dummy—but the plan fell apart when Mr. Champion put up the 10 spot. Mr. Abel frowned and stared at the ceiling. It didn't help him. If he let the 10 hold, another diamond lead would undoubtedly follow and, on the bidding, the king was almost certainly in Mr. Dale's hand.

Finally, he played his queen. Mr. Dale won with the king and returned the jack. Another dia-

mond had to be lost, for down he went.

Mr. Abel could have made the hand by another play—and regardless of how good the defense was. After stripping the clubs and picking up the trumps, all he had to do was to lead dummy's last heart and pitch the eight of diamonds on it. That would put Mr. Dale in for sure.

His return would have to be a diamond, which would go into the ace-queen; or a club which could be ruffed on the board while Mr. Abel got rid of his queen of diamonds.
