OUTDOORS With Marty

ENSANADA, Mexico, May 31—The long-awaited vacation days came at last, and the man out at Mud Lake tells you that chances do not seem so good since they quit biting last week. Brother Joe was smart, he went to the seashore this year. He can always get fish in the salt chuck.

But he gets the same story, and after nearly 3,000 miles of travel your columnist also reports the oft-repeated tale.

Down here the yellowtails (rumming in schools of around 18-pounds) were falling a limit per rod. In the middle of May a heavy southeaster came and tore up the kelp beds and put the fish away down deep. So if time holds good I must wait them out. What else can an angler do?

No signs of swordfish, no sails either, plenty of the common bottom fish. The boat I was aboard today, five times hung heavy jewfish (in the 200-pound class), but the light surface tackle that is used for school tuna and albacore was useless for the task. Nothing to do but cut free and try again.

A few so-called halibut were taken, little fellows of four pounds or so, the same red rockfish we know so well, and many sporty one-pound croakers. Met a new one called Garibaldi, just like a large ordinary goldfish, but almost impossible to take on a hook since his entire feed is small molluscs and crustaceans; he cracks them as we crack nutshells!

Tomorrow we cross the peninsula of Baja California to a small place called San Felipe. The expectation is for large groupers, heavy tackle will be the order of the day. Took four barracuda, these strikingly similar in appearance and mode of combat to the great northern pike, but very much faster and longer fighting, an excellent

table fish. Best fish 11 pounds, 40 is a good one, but I'm trying!

The interest in outdoor things in the United States is terrific. One lake, about six miles by three was stocked with seven-inch trout and declared open to angling. On opening day no fewer than 1,643 boats of all car portable kinds, were counted upon this smallish water and practically all hand captured some of these tender little hand-raised innocents! Evidently the hatchery trucks carry a grain of truth.

Down here there is up to four inches of rain per year and in consequence the ocean comes in for heavy fishing but the urge for fresh water work is hard to satisfy. Commenting on the difference in conditions here and in Prince Rupert, one man who knows both places says that in the north it is hard to find a spot to keep dry in while the Californian has difficulty finding a little old wet spot to fish in!

Saw several black-tail deer and fawns in Oregon, none appeared in too good condition, possibly because dry weather had yellowed much of the country. Mountain quail are plentiful and tame. Desert lizards away south are surprisingly speedy, many sizes and kinds could be found in a one-mile walk.

Here is a believe-it-or-not-for you. Have seen and photographed a two-headed snake. More later. Hasta luego amigos, buena suerte!
