The musical section of the syllabus includes classes in junior choral work, vocal solos and duets, violin solos and duets, accordion solos and ensembles, instrumental groups and organ olos, as well as a wide variety pianoforte classes. In the latter there are general classes for all age groups as well as classes in Bach, Beethoven and Chopin and a class for Sona-

The drama section includes plays by elementary schools, ally, a scene from Shakespeare's plays, involving at least two characters.

The syllabus provides for seven classes in elocution, for youngsters in grades one to eight, and four classes in choral speaking, also for grades one to eight.

Dancing classes, five in all, include ballet or acrobatic, tap, Scottish, folk and character dancing.






