

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## Cabinet Authorizes Damming Project on Buttle Lake

VICTORIA.—The provincial Cabinet has authorized B.C. Power Commission to proceed with damming of Buttle Lake and construct two new hydroelectric plants in the province.

Authority for the three moves was given by order-in-council.

The order respecting Buttle Lake includes 12 special conditions for preserving the aesthetic value of the lake which were recommended to the last session of the Legislature by a special committee which investigated the dam proposal, and recommended that a dam be allowed.

The two power plants which the Cabinet has authorized will be located on the Puntledge River, near Courtenay, and at Spillimacheen, in the Rockies.

There may be some opposition to the Cabinet move authorizing the Buttle Lake dam.

In some minds there is a question of whether the Cabinet has authority to make such an order.

While the special legislative committee filed its report with the House before it prorogued, the report was never considered by the House.

Opposition Leader Harold Winch had a motion on the order paper to have the House consider the report in committee of the whole but the House dis-

solved before this was done.

The Cabinet order also au-

thorizes B.C. Power Commission to sell merchantable timber which it must cut from the lake shore.

This, too, might be challenged. During hearings before the committee there was lengthy argument over who would have the right to sell the timber to be cut.

It was argued by some that B.C. Power Commission was not in the timber business and did not understand logging and therefore dispensing of the timber should be in the hands of the government's department of Lands and Forests, and the revenue from the timber sale should go right to the government, not to the Commission.
