A good fit in partner's suit and solidity in your own suit or suits are important considerations. Here is a good yardstick. Make a jump shift when you are willing to make a slam try if partner promptly raises your suit or makes some rebid which is not of the minimum variety.

NO REASON FOR SHIFT

When your hand is about the equal of an opening bid or even a little better, there is usually no reason to make a jump shift. It is very probable that you have lead.
