Missionary Misses Lonely

LONDON (Routers) -- A missionary just returned to London's crowded streets after three years island, is homesick for the island.

The noise of the traffic, added to the coughing, wheezing and sneezing, is almost terrifying," said Rev. Dennis Wilkinson.

Amid the jostling throngs of Londoners caught up in the current wave of head colds and influenza, he thought wistfully of Tristan de Cunha, where illness is almost unknown.

"It is even treated as something of an emergency if any one does is when a ship goes by. The ship does not even have to call."

Tristan is a tiny island in the South Atlantic about 2,000 miles west of the tip of South Africa, It has about 300 inhabitants, no stores, automobiles, railroads, telephones or mevie houses.
