Salmon Fisherman

Succumbed After Falling Into Water

Effect of shock and exposure after falling into the water at Hunmpback Bay, Porcher Island, is believed to have caused the death there Monday afternoon of George McKenzie, veteran salmon troller of this district. The remains were brought here yesterday afternoon by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police aboard the Canadian Fishing Co.'s fish packer Hillside, Coroner E. D. Forward satisfied himself that death was due to natural causes.

McKenzie was working about 150 yards from shore aboard two skiffs and is believed to have fallen into the water while stepping from one into the other. His cries for help were heard from shore and, when a rescuer arrived on the scene in another skiff, McKenzie was clinging to an overturned boat. A very heavy man, weighing 250 to 275 pounds, it was impossible to pull him out of the water into a boat even when further help arrived from shore. Finally, he was towed ashore clinging to the boat.

On reaching shore, he was able to walk to his cabin where he was warmed up and put in bed at 12:30 noon. Three hours later friends called and he was sitting up in bed, apparently none the worse. At 5 p.m. he was found
