SENO, Indo-China (P)—French
paratroopers and North African
troops kept up a "deadly game
of hide and seek" today with
Communist-led Vietnamese guer-
rillas in the jungle northeast
of this French-held Laotian
fortress.

The French forces claimed
more than 1,000 casualties
among their rebel enemy and
asserted they had wiped out any
serious Vietminh menace in
central Laos.

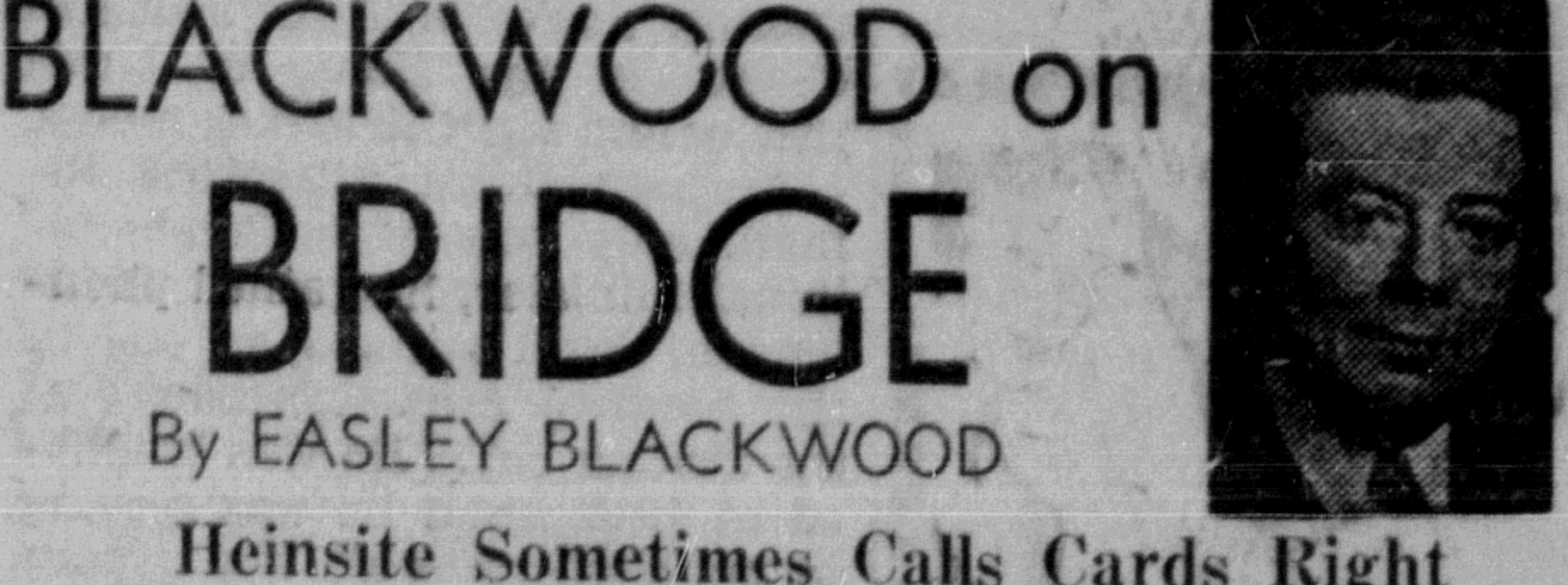

Heinsite Sometimes Calls Cards Right

Mr. Heinsite is not above expecting his partner to drop singleton kings and doubleton queens when there are five or six cards of a suit outstanding. In most cases, of course, this is completely unreason-able. But there was an odd twist in today's deal which made Mr. Heinsite's criticism correct and justified.

Mr. Dale led the five of hearts and his partner won with the ace and returned the four. Here Mr. Dale made a thoughtful play. He could have gone up with the king and led a third round of hearts, hoping to get in later with the king of di-amoonds. Instead, he ducked the trick to give the impression that he had no possible side entries and that the only way to reach his hand was in the heart suit itself.

Dummy's ten won the second trick and Mr. Muzzy saw he had no chance for his contract unless he brought in the di-amoonds. At trick three he led a diamond from the board and finessed the queen. Mr. Dale won with his lone king and cashed three heart tricks to put the hand down one.

"Bang down your ace of di-amoonds. Don't take the finesse," screamed Mr. Heinsite. "That's ridiculous," Mr. Muz-zy replied. "With four diamonds out, how could I be expected to know Dale had a singleton king?"

He appealed to Mr. Dale to support his argument but the old master had to admit that this time (whether by chance or no) Mr. Heinsite had some-thing.

"He's right, Muzzy," Mr. Dale said. "Your correct play at the third trick was to lay down the ace of diamonds—and not because you could figure me for the lone king. The point is that you could afford to lose a di-iamond trick to Mrs. Keen. If she won, the second lead of di-amoonds with the king, she would have no heart to return. Or, if she did, then the hearts would be divided evenly and we could win only three hearts and a diamond.

"You could not afford to lose a diamond to me. Now, if I had the king of diamonds, guarded, you were never going to make the hand. But you had absolute-ly nothing to lose by making a safety play against the possi-bility that I had the king all by itself."

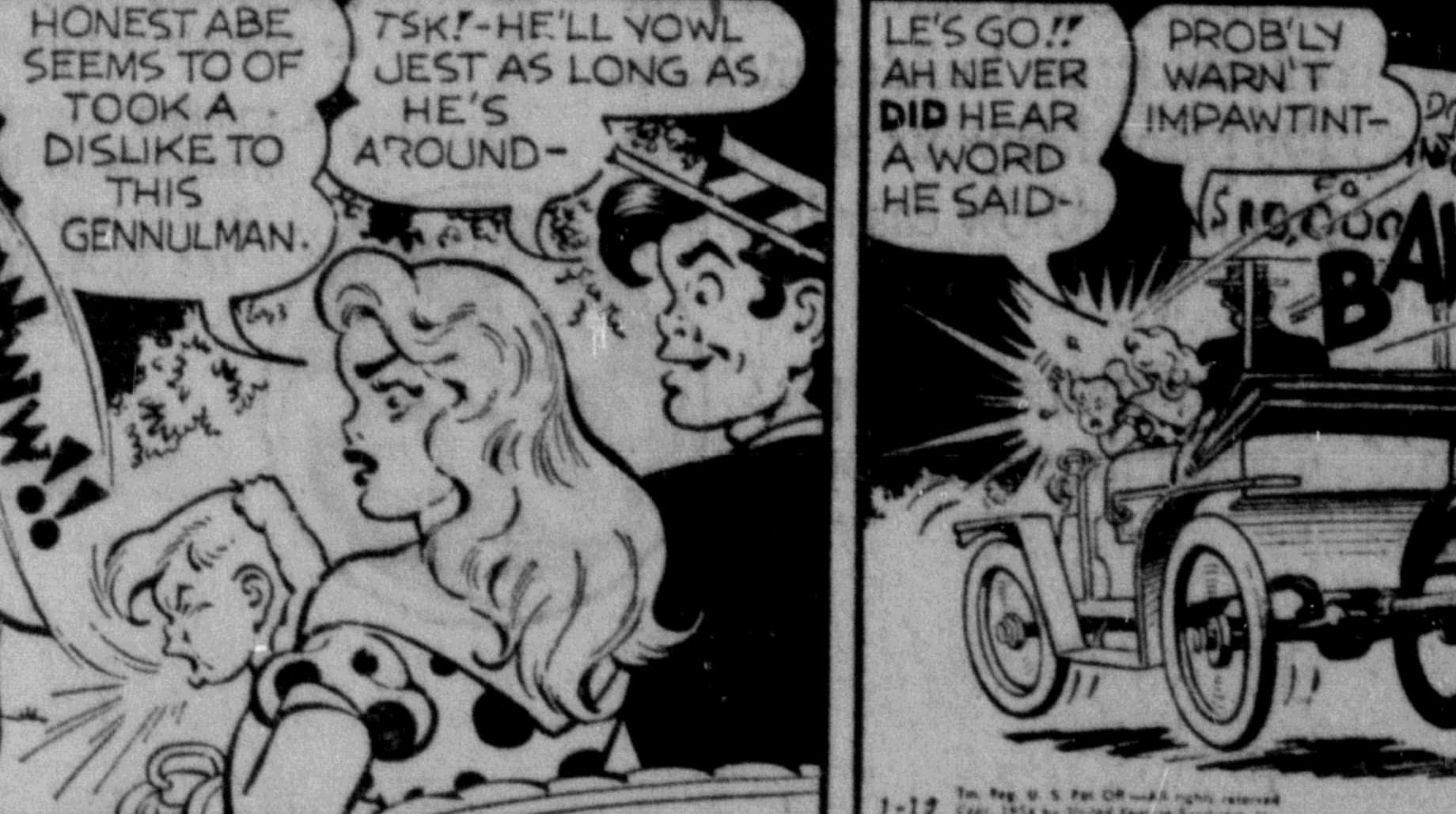
