We are so timid about speaking to others about our Saviour, that we keep silent when folks may, be longing for our help; or else we are so concerned with our own burdens, that we have no 100m for those of others.

"Take my yoke upon you," said Christ to the weary and heavyladen, "and you shall find rest unto your souls. My yoke (of service) is easy." What is more, our faith will be rekindled. What a tremendous debt the Church at home owes to its missionaries, who have revealed to us a world where God is at work. The light they carried into dark places has reflected back to the Church at home a greater vision of God's grace and power, and of His redeeming purpose.

And only as we share our christian faith with the lost and needy around us, in adventurous service, can it grow and deepen into a more permanent possession. "Arise, and shine, for thy Light is come," said the phophet to the exiles in Babylon. Our Light is Christ and His salvation. And this is God's word to us today.


