Political War Splits Vancouver's Chinatown

VANCOUVER (CP)—A political war has split Vancouver's Chinatown into hostile camps and has brought threats of death to prominent Chinese.

The current "war" started last month with formation of two new organizations in Chinatown the third largest on the continent with a population of about 10,000.

One organization is pledged to support Chiang Kai-shek. The other is against signing any pledge of support.

Chinese-Canadians who have refused to support the pro-Chiang faction have been sent anonymous letters threatening death, and the Chinese Times. published by the Chinese Free-

gation.




