This 'Special Ripe Olive Sauce' a variation of meat sauce for spaghetti, noodles or rice which is unusual in that there is no skillet, cooking of ingredients. Olives, ground beef, tomatoes and seasonings are baked in the oven for about 40 minutes. Then a generous amount of cheese is added in and the sauce baked about 10 minutes longer.

SPECIAL RIPE OLIVE SAUCE 1/2 cup ripe olives 1/2 pound ground beef

1 minced small clove garlic 1/2 cup finely chopped onion 1 cup canned or cooked to-

matoes 1 teaspoon chili powder 2 tablespoons oil or melted

4 teaspoon salt 1/2 cups chopped American

butter

Cut olives in large pieces. Combine with beef, garlic, onion, tomatoes, chili powder, oil and salt. Pour into greased baking dish. Bake in moderately hot oven (375° F.) about 40 minutes. Stir in cheese and bake 10 minutes longer. Serve hot over noodles, spaghetti or rice.
