## Indonesia Tired of Years of Civil War, Like Army Without Backing of Sergeants

Will Indonesia follow Indo-China as a Communist target? William L. Ryan of The Associated Press here discusses Indonesia's strategic place in Southeast Asia. Ryan, after a six-week tour of Southeast Asia, went to Geneva to check his findings with diplomatic sources.

GENEVA (AP)—A polished young Indonesian political leader, laughing in spite of himself, said:

"My country is like an army without sergeants."

It was a bitter laugh. The analogy he drew was of an army with too many generals ready to plan but with no non-coms behind them to carry out the job.

Riotously rich in nature's gifts, the Indonesian island chain is poor in political fibre. The apathy of the Indonesian people, their illiteracy, their disillusionment with talk of democracy, all tend to create a dangerous political vacuum in a country newly emerged from colonial domination.

The Indonesians are tired of years of civil war and years of violence at the hands of terrorist organizations. The weariness extends to the top, to the thin layer of able, educated intellectuals left behind when the Dutch withdrew. The Dutch, unlike British colonists, did not see fit to leave any broad civil service to administer the countries.

From all this, the observer gets the impression of a country on the verge of a national nervous breakdown. And the impression is strong, too, that Indonesia offers the next line of least resistance to Communist expansion plans.

Here in Geneva the Communists are displaying an all-or-nothing attitude on the question of Indo-China. The implication is that eventually they expect to take all.

Then the next move in the step-by-step expansion program could be Indonesia, by-passing Burma, Thailand and Malaya. In Moscow's geopolitical thinking, Indonesia is a rich prize. And Moscow could use Indonesia's oil, tin and rubber.

Has Russia immediate designs on Indonesia?

"Semi-colonial Indonesia is subject to permanent economic crisis," says the Indonesia communist party's most recent directive. "The way to eliminate this situation is to liquidate this semi-colonial status and replace it with the system of people's Communist democracy."

**REDS NOT STRONG**

Indonesia has 80,000,000 people. The Communist party claims only 126,000 members, but it is seeking to capture the minds of that section of the literate population which is the only significant force.

Indonesian nationalist leaders profess to see no connection between communism and what is going on in Indo-China. As nationalists, they consider as patriotic any movement aimed at routing the foreigner. There is much Marxism—as distinguished
