



Official opening of the curling rink is planned for February 16 and it will culminate a year of planning and several months of long voluntary hours of labor. A small group of "dry-land curlers" who organized a club last January would not accept public opinion that an artificial ice rink here was "unfeasible."

Located at Seal Cove, near the B. C. Packers cold storage plant, the building which would house three sheets of ice and clubroom facilities was the answer, enthusiastic curlers decided.

Brine from the cold storage plant could be pumped across a 30-foot rock bluff and into the rink. The curling club would pay a rental fee for this privilege. This arrangement was made quickly.

A campaign was launched immediately to sell \$100 memberships to prospective curlers. Headed by Mr. Moore who has sparked the program from its infancy, the drive brought in 150 members.

Another problem stood in the way. It was a matter of 16,000 feet of two-inch pipe, high on the priority list of essential ma-
