

Squadron to Take Part National Air Cadet Week

Prince Rupert Air Cadets, squadron 559, will participate in celebrating national Air Cadet week April 12-18, Flight Lieutenant Dick Garrett, commanding officer, announced today.

Prince Rupert Air Cadet sponsoring committee, said Cadets are "young men who wish to avail themselves of the opportunity to become better citizens through Air Cadet training."

"We are confident the parents and all citizens here are behind our young men of tomorrow."

Chairman of the committee's financial campaign is Jack Laurie.

All cadets yesterday wore their uniforms throughout the day to commemorate the birth of the Royal Canadian Air Force, April 1, 29 years ago.

On April 10, the squadron's first Easter Ball will take place. Since the cadets are sponsored by a civilian committee, they do not come under court mourning for the late Queen Mary.

F/L Garrett said he was proud of his squadron.

"The cadets are in their first year of training and are an exceptional group, doing better than average by far in every undertaking."

The Prince Rupert squadron is one of 326 in Canada. More than 75,000 Canadian boys have received Air Cadet training since the movement was founded in 1941; more than 50,000 have attended summer camps; close to 2,000 have been taught to fly.

Goodwill exchange trips abroad have been made by 307 top cadets, and 80 have received educational scholarships at a total value of \$50,000.

During the past two years more than 30 new Air Cadet squadrons have been formed in Canada.

"It's not in the province of man to regulate God, but rather the reverse. Good Friday was man's attempt to regulate life. Easter was God's answer. I ask you to remember John Massfield's words: that the only constant thing is change."
