Board-a-Match Play Is Interesting Change From Regular Contract Method

The team of four contest between Mr. Masters' club and the Uptown Club was played on a board-a-match basis. If you are not acquainted with that method, here is a word of explanation.

Two members of your team play the North-South hands against two members of the other team. The cards are not tossed onto the table as a rubber bridge, but each player plays his cards in front of him so that, when the hand is over, he has the same thirteen cards he started with.

The director of the contest then takes these hands and places them in the same relative position on a table in another room. There, the other half of your team plays the same deal, holding the East-West hands. The other half of the opposing team, of course, holds the North-South hands.

EACH HAND IS MATCH

Each hand is a match. You either win it, lose it or tie it. You win it if your team has a net plus.

For example, if your North-South pair has a score of minus 100 on a hand and your East-West pair has a score of plus 200, you win the match because, as a team, you have a net plus score.

When the score is exactly the same in both rooms, that is a tie and each team has won a half match.
