Fair Trade Pact To Cut Tariffs
 OTTAWA—Canada will slash tariffs on Japanese goods in the next few months when a "fair trade" pact between the two countries will be ready for signing, well-informed sources disclosed Friday.
 Custom duties in some cases will be cut to half, widening the potential Canadian market for Japanese goods and possibly reducing prices to Canadian buyers of such items as Japanese textiles, china, cameras, novelties and toys.
