The RCMP last year chased cigarette smugglers, got motion picture evidence of illegal trafficking in narcotics and identified a missing woman after a survey of dental records.

Floating Weather Stations Collect Data For Forecasts

Every day of the year a converted wartime frigate steams in a 10-mile square in the Pacific ocean about 1,000 miles west of Vancouver. Behind this routine voyage is the story of Canada's floating weather stations.

The 10-mile square is the centre of station P, an area 210 miles square where the frigate, fitted with the latest recording instruments and manned by meteorologists and sailors, collects the data on which weather forecasts are based.

This perpetual vigil is shared in 42-day patrols by two vessels—the St. Catherine and Stone- town. Their 57-man crews report weather conditions on the surface and at various altitudes. The reports advise airmen and mariners of storms or of favorable winds.

Although collecting the weather data is the primary job, the ship at station P also is equipped to go to the help of distressed ships and airmen.

Station P is one of Canada's chief responsibilities to the International Civil Aviation Organization to provide a network of ocean stations for weather information.

A day aboard the 300-foot ship at station P is divided in much the same way as a land-work, recreation and sleep.

Living quarters on the frigate are roomier than a frigate in wartime could boast. There also is a well-equipped recreation room where all ranks may watch movies twice weekly, join in sing-songs, play table tennis, cards or games, read or listen to the radio-phonograph.

port of the federal force under the heading "interesting cases." But the report, cut this year to about a third its normal size, contained no reference to the work of police dogs, or of the force's marine and air sections or to the force's work in the northland.

Commissioner L. H. Nicholson said it is hoped to give more attention to these sections of the force in future reports.

The chase of the cigarette smugglers occurred near St. Nicholas Station, Que. Two cars were chased by Mounties, one overturned and another escaped. In the overturned vehicle police found 192,000 smuggled American cigarettes. As a result of information gained by police, subsequent seizures of cigarettes totalling more than 500,000 were made, the second car was found and seized, and eight men were charged and convicted.

FOUR ARRESTED
The drug case involved three men and a woman arrested at Winnipeg by the RCMP following a lengthy investigation of their activities. Two autos also were seized and a feature of the case was the introduction of motion pictures at the preliminary hearing "showing the movements of the accused at various times during the investigation including the actual deliveries."

All were convicted though the case went to the Supreme Court of Canada on a point of law.
The missing woman was Mrs. William Robert Brown of Glace Bay, N.S., who disappeared with her husband while on a trip in Nova Scotia in 1948. Their abandoned car was found on the outskirts of Stewiacke, N.S., but there was no evidence of foul play.

BODY FOUND
Two and a half years later the partly decomposed body of a woman was taken from the Shubenacadie river, about 11 miles from the point where the car had been located. Ordinary identification was impossible and the RCMP set about a survey of dental offices in Nova Scotia, finally locating a dentist who recognized his work and identified the body as that of Mrs. Brown.
No trace of Mr. Brown has been found to date.
