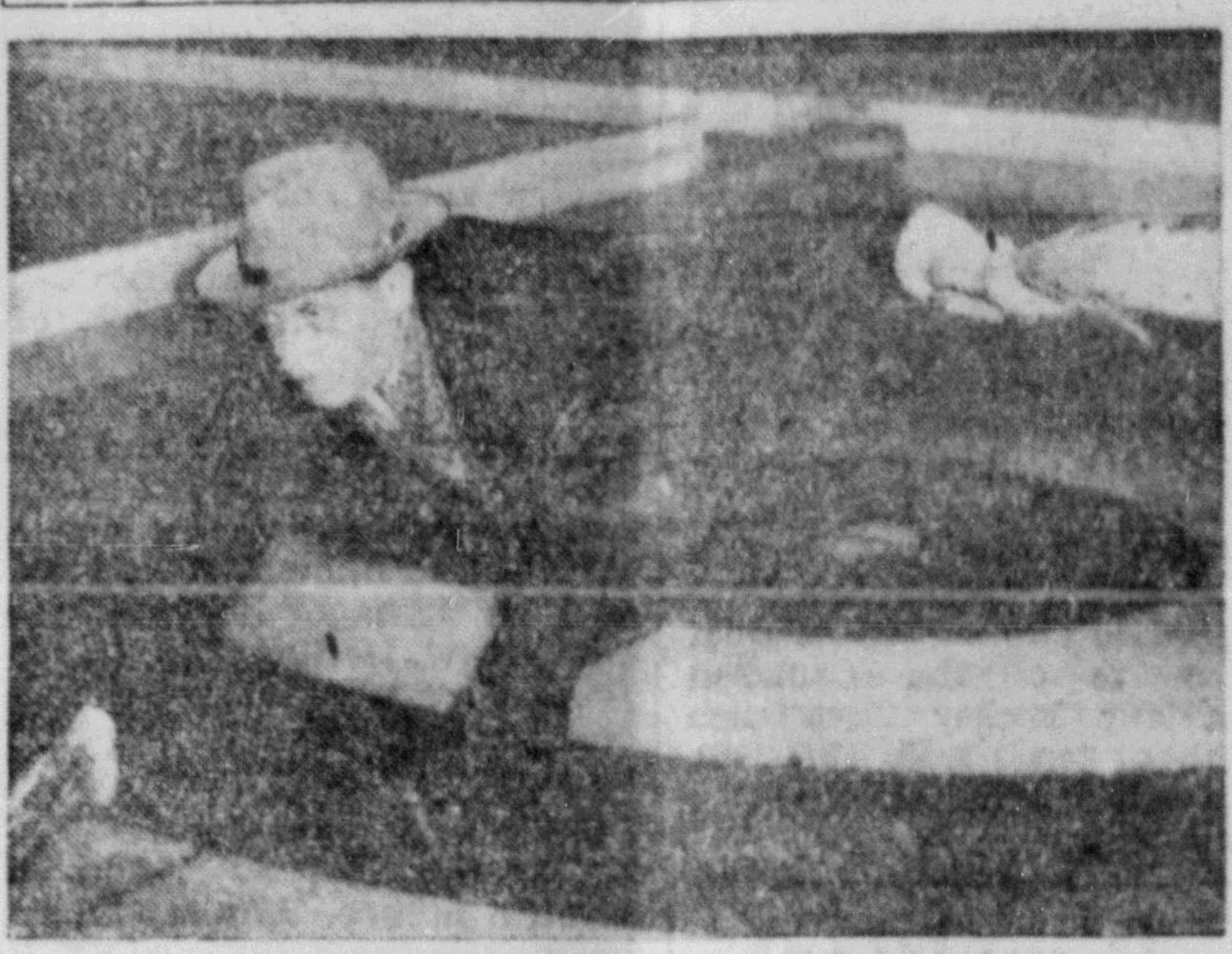

YOU SLIDE WITH YOUR EARS


Some people should never use the sliding delivery at all, even though they try to perfect the true follow-through. It is a physiological fact that the cochlea or inner-ear contains fluid and nerve centres that give you a sense of balance. Look around amongst your friends for a moment. Some are as sure as a cat on their feet, and rarely have tumbles or bad falls. Others are continually nursing sprained ankles and broken bones because of an unnatural sense of balance.

The fact that my brother, Grant and myself had no difficulty in balance. In effect, they are thumbing a ride because they are not fortunately born this way and can be thankful for it. For those who want to slide, yet have to lean on the broom or the stone to help give them a sense of security in balance, I suggest either shortening or eliminating the slide. Otherwise you are in for a lot of disappointments. Riding the rock or riding the broom in order to copy the slide will make you a "pusher" or a "hooker." Both are loaded with disaster.

If you have to slide, use the broom as a balance with the straw pointed forward so that you will not be pulled off line as you go out from the hack. Those who are placing part of the weight of the body on the broom straw pointed behind them or at the left side will find it acting as a brake, with the result that the body swivels to the right on the slippery ice surface. This causes "hooking" of the stone towards the broom at the end of the slide and is more noticeable when an in-turn is played.

One of the most beautiful deliveries to watch is that of a player who rides his broom during the delivery and many young curlers in Manitoba have copied this style. It looks good. It feels good, but no Manitoba curlers will ever win a Canadian championship or high school title with this type of delivery.

Here's Difference Between Free Bid and Force Bid

Mr. Muzzy will never learn the difference between a free bid and a forced bid—or a bid which can be assumed to have been made under some sort of pressure.

When he said one spade in today's deal, he was making a free bid—for which he did not have the values. If the diamond bid had been passed on his right, then, of course, he would have been justified in bidding a spade.

But that would have been merely for the purpose of giving partner another chance in case she had a big hand. When Mr. Meek overcalled, Miss Brash automatically got another chance to bid and a "keep-open" bid by Mr. Muzzy was not only unnecessary, it was highly dangerous.

Mr. Dale's double of one spade looks a little odd, but there was method in the old master's apparent madness. He considered the humanics of the situation. His partner was Mr. Meek and when Mr. Meek overcalls vulnerable, he has a very fine hand.

On Mr. Dale's left was Miss Brash, a known overbidder and also famous as a rescuer. On his right was Mr. Muzzy who needs no descriptive comment.

A final consideration was that the double of one spade would probably prevent Mr. Meek from bidding any more in the heart suit.

Miss Brash's first try for a better spot was one no-trump. When Mr. Meek doubled that, she took a shot at two diamonds, which Mr. Dale doubled.

As you see, the contract was a hopeless one and when the smoke cleared away Miss Brash was down 800 points.

To come into the bidding as he did, Mr. Muzzy needed at least another ace or the equivalent thereof. In other words, he

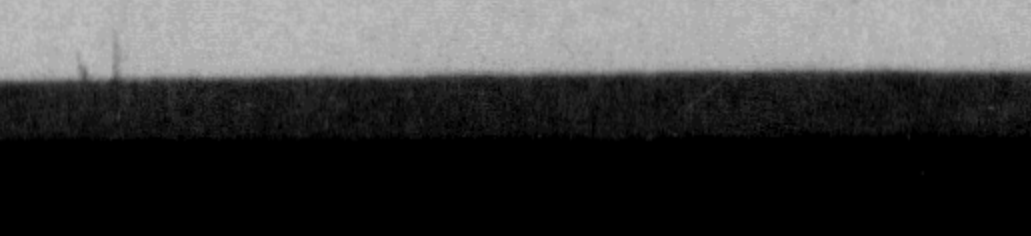
