To Build Road on Sherbrooke Ave.

City council last night acceded to a petition from the property owners of Sherbrooke Avenue in the McClymont Park area for the building of an 18-foot road at a cost of about \$15,000. The road will be 1770 feet long of which 1070 feet will be a charge to the city, the cost to be divided between property owners and city in that ratio. The city clerk was instructed by the council to proceed with the drawing up of the necessary bylaw.
