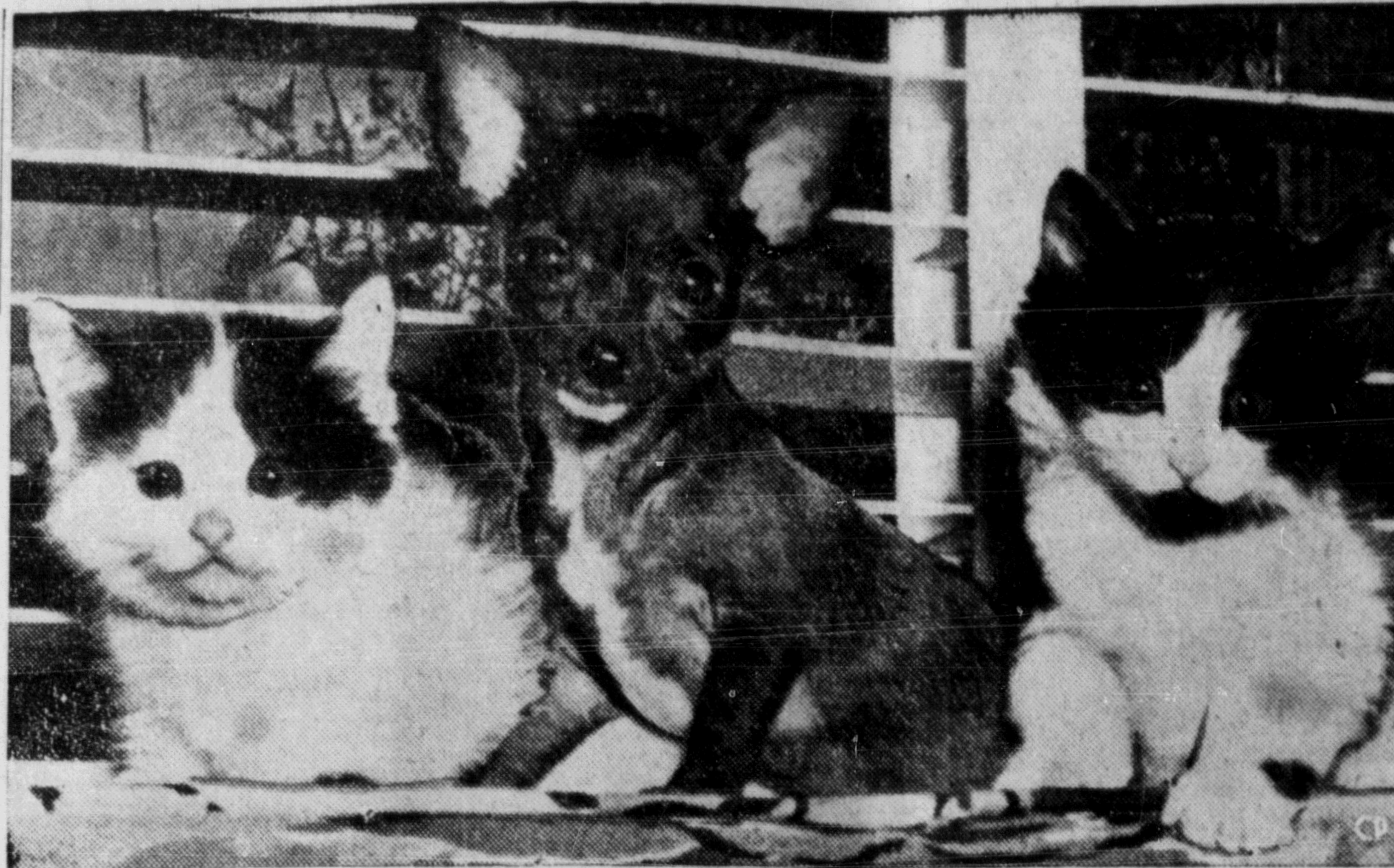

Greatest Hero

Lindy Flew to Paris 25 Years Ago
But Today He Lives in Anonymity

NEW YORK (AP)—Twenty-five years ago, they were the daring folk of the flying machines.

Some flew oceans solo for the first time. Others proved multi-engine planes could reach far lands. They set long-distance records and hearts fluttering. They won acclaim aboard and at home.

Today, these air pioneers of the great ocean-hopping craze of 1927 are scarcely known to later generations of hero worshippers. Some still fly. Some don't. But almost all of them, knowing now what they know about aviation, wouldn't dare make the same flight in the same plane.

There was Charles Augustus Lindbergh. May 20, 1927, he took "The Spirit of St. Louis" up through the morning mist at Roosevelt Field, Long Island, and headed east. Thirty-nine hours and 29 minutes later he landed in Paris. More than 30,000 Frenchmen closed in on him, and the age of heroes had its greatest hero.

Other, bigger planes were waiting to take off for the \$25,000 prize posted for the first non-stop flight to Paris. Lindbergh got away first, and with little fuss. He simply said, "So long," and took off.

Lindbergh was feted all over Europe, returned to the United States aboard a cruiser and was greeted with 1800 tons of confetti in New York. (The armistice in 1918 lasted only 150 tons.) He was presented the Congressional Medal of Honor and other decorations by President Calvin Coolidge.

In the last 25 years, Lindbergh has been the object of world adulation for his flight; intense sympathy for the fatal kidnapping of his son in 1932, and bitter controversy for his "America First" stand in the years before the attack on Pearl Harbor Dec. 7, 1941.

Today, at 50, Lindbergh lives with his wife, the former Anne Morrow, and their three sons

Veteran Captain
Recalls Disaster
Thai Shook Japan

VANCOUVER (CP)—With about half a century of seafaring behind him, Captain Samuel Robinson, 82, now is content to sit in his armchair and reminisce.

The retired silver-haired mariner speaks modestly of his days on the sea which began in 1884, before his 14th birthday. His career started from his native England and continued through 37 years on the Pacific, which he crossed more than 350 times.

In his personal logbook is an account of the disastrous Yokohama earthquake and fire of 1923 in which, as master of the Empress of Australia, he directed the rescue of some 4,000 refugees.

"I thought the end of the world had come," he said, speaking of the fateful September day.

There was a roar... then the whole waterfront just dropped

and two daughters at Darien, Conn.

He lives in an anonymity of his own choosing. He sees no reporters, grants no interviews.

And then there was Clarence Chamberlin.

When Lindbergh reached Paris, Chamberlin painted out "New York to Paris" on his Bellanca monoplane. He changed his goal to Berlin.

Until the last minute, the identity of his passenger remained secret. It turned out to be Charles A. Levine, millionaire manufacturer.

Early in the morning of June 4, 1927, with Levine at the controls of the "Columbia" at Roosevelt Field, both men took off for Berlin.

After 46½ hours, during which they set a long-distance record, Chamberlin and Levine ran out of gas. They landed in a wheat field at Eiseleben, 110 miles southwest of Berlin. They, too, won big receptions aboard and at home. Chamberlin made \$75,000 in prizes, lectures, endorsements and personal appearances.

Today, the white-haired flier makes his home in Bridgeport, Conn., where he operates a dairy farm and foreign car agency.

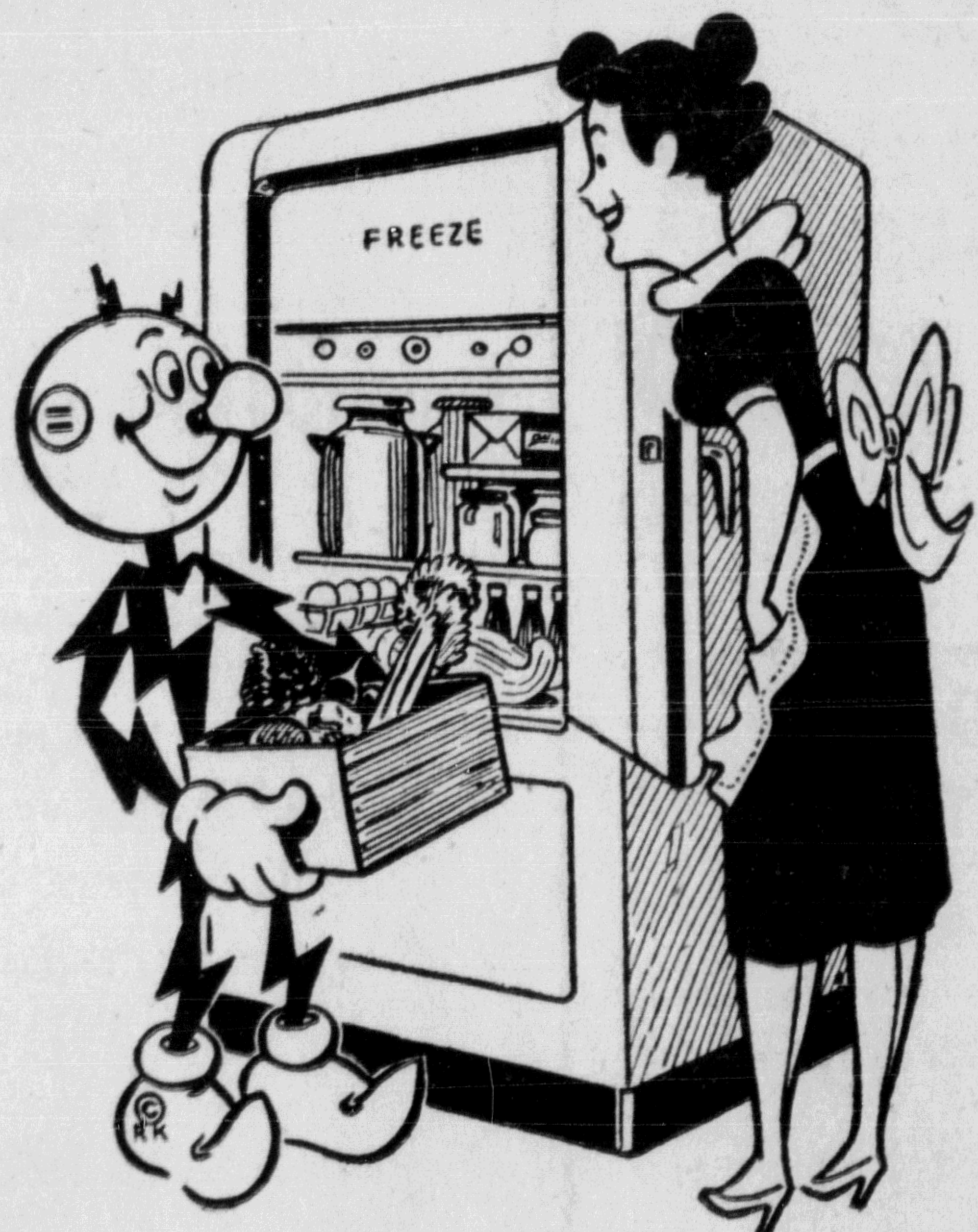
