

PURSUED BY MONSTER

Dr. N. M. Carter, a former resident of Prince Rupert, and for many years identified with the fisheries experimental station here, has been answering questions put to him by a fish- Monday to Wednesday erman of Vancouver, where Dr. Carter has been living since moving from the north. The fisherman thinks he has been pursued by some marine monster and cannot figure out just what it might have been.

Dr. Carter says he declines to state there are no such creatures as sea serpents. What the fisherman was scared of might have been a wolf-eel which looks like an eel, but isn't. It is rarely more than eight feet, with a vicious looking mouth. Or it could have been a basking shark. or the thresher shark with an 'elongated tail. It will be remembered that, when Dr. Carter was a Prince Rupert resident, discovery of a weird looking sea creature on an island shore near here occurred. Great and farreaching was the excitement. Speculation as to its identity even got into the London press. Eventually, after examination in Victoria, it was established as a basking shark, some of which grow 40 feet in length, told his
