Spruce Umbrellas For April Showers

PARIS (Reuters)—Dame Fashion is all set to look pert and chic this year despite April showers.

Fashion designers have given the usually mundane umbrella a beauty treatment and made it a "must" accessory to provide the finishing touch for the smart prints making a fashion comeback.

Prints appear in flattering parasols and full-fledged umbrellas, in waterproofed silk.

New mottled and blurred prints are offered as are small flowered and tie-silk designs.

Stripes and polka dots are to the fore.

Solid shaded effects lend gay touches to sombre outfits. One cover is a brilliant flame color at the centre, grading out to a deep violet.

For those who prefer less fantasy, there are solid-toned models, often featured with a contrasting colored lining. Vivid tangerine lines the underside of one white shantung model. Chartreuse and purple offer another spicy combination.

There is news in handles and shapes, too. The most popular new style features a slim, straight-lined handle. This style has generally replaced the crooked handles and Chamberlain models of the past seasons.

Bone, glass, wood and even china lend new effects. One model, in ivory, has the top carved like a miniature totem pole.

Animal heads provide a popular motif on many handles. A whole barnyard full of dogs, cranes, and even scaly snakes appear in carved wood, bone or leather, complete with glass or jeweled eyes.

The feminine parasol, reminiscent of the gay 90s, also reappears on the fashion scene. Lace, ruffles and embroidery cast a flattering shadow on the modern miss's face.

THE EXPERTS Say...

Forty-five thousand women in farming communities throughout Quebec — members of Les Cercles de Fermieres — are behind the National Council of Women's drive for "thrift."

The association director, Miss Anne-Marie Vaillancourt, of Quebec City, says various suggestions about economizing have been distributed to members of "Les Cercles" which were first organized in 1915 and are similar to the Women's Institutes in English-speaking sections of the country.

Miss Vaillancourt has offered a few personal suggestions for stretching the meat budget.

As an economical dinner she recommends: Carrot pin-wheel meat loaf; creamed potatoes; canned peas with celery; heated rolls with butter or margarine; lemon meringue pie or tarts.

Carrot pin-wheel meat loaf: One pound hamburger; 1½ teaspoons salt; one-quarter teaspoon pepper; one onion minced; one egg (grade B); one tablespoon milk; one cup soft bread crumbs; 1½ cups shredded raw carrots; two tablespoons minced parsley.

Mix ingredients except carrots and parsley. Roll on sheet of wax paper with a wet rolling-pin to make a rectangle six inches wide and one-half inch thick. Spread with mixture of carrots and parsley. Roll like jelly-roll. Put in shallow baking pan. Bake in

moderate oven (350 degrees Fahrenheit) for one hour.

ECONOMICAL SUPPER

As a suggested supper menu: Ketchup-glazed meat loaf; oven-browned potatoes; broccoli; bread and butter or margarine; warm gingerbread with apple butter.

Ketchup-glazed meat loaf: 1½ pounds hamburger; one egg (grade B); one cup soft bread crumbs; one cup milk; one chopped onion; 1¼ teaspoons salt; one-quarter teaspoon pepper; one-half teaspoon poultry seasoning; one-quarter cup ketchup.

Mix all ingredients except ketchup. Shape into a roll and put in shallow pan. Spread ketchup evenly over meat. Bake in moderate oven (350 degrees Fahrenheit) about one hour.

Macaroni Ragout: One-half cup chopped onion; one-half cup diced celery; one-quarter cup fat or salad oil; one pound ground veal and pork; three

cups canned tomatoes; two cups kidney beans; one eight-ounce package shell macaroni (cooked); salt and pepper to taste; one teaspoon chili powder. Sauté onion and celery in fat in a skillet. Add meat; cook until brown, using side of a spoon to break into small pieces. Add remaining ingredients. Cook 30 minutes or until thick. Six servings.
