

The resemblance is only skin deep, however. Petter's plans discount the possibility of the Gnat being merely an expendable addition to existing arma-

What he has in mind is a heavy - hitting fighter, with swept wings, two 20 or 30-millimetre guns, light ejector seat, radio, big body fuel tanks and possible radar range-finding equipment for the guns.

Petter estimates the combined weight of the necessary equipment plus pilot may total only 2,250 pounds, 40 per cent of the plane's total weight.

He calls his hypothetical craft a practical flying weapon whose short production time and saving on man-hours in construction "makes possible efficient production in many countries which might otherwise not be able to contribute to their own and North Atlantic Treaty Organization defence."
