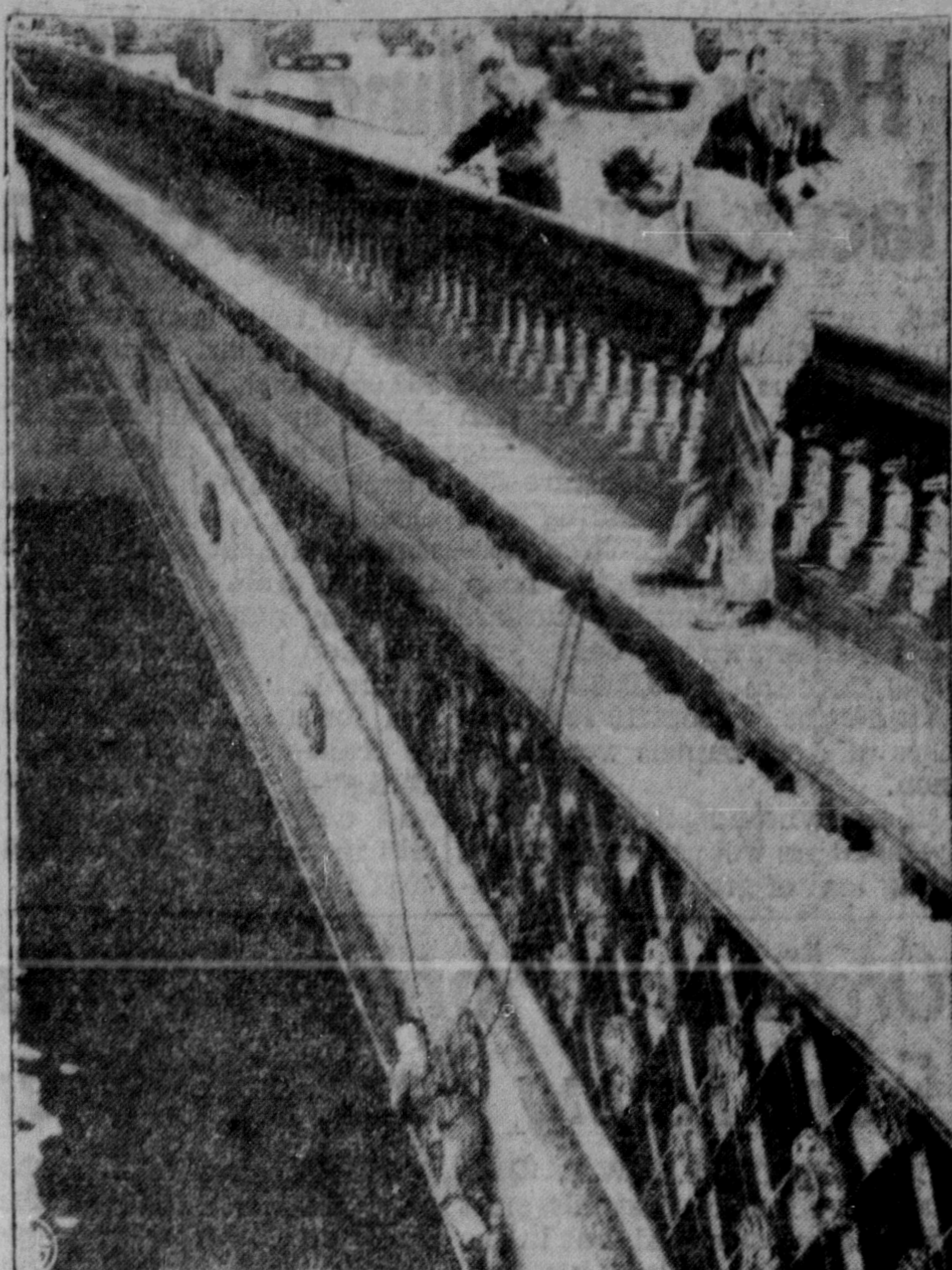

**Betting Operation Run Inside Mental Hospital**

CHICAGO (AP)—The bizarre story of a horse race betting handbook operated in a mental institution by a physician, an inmate of several years, and the inmate's woman friend was told this week by Police Chief Patrick C. Tuohy and Dr. Otto Bettag, state welfare director.

Bettag said the suicide of a nurse in the Chicago state hospital Aug. 7 after she had lost heavily on bets placed with the bookie gave authorities their first tangible lead.

However, he said, betting operations were believed to have extended over several years.

Tuohy said Mrs. Dorothy Hughes, 31, told of picking up bets of \$30 a day when she called daily on Martin Wanzig, 42, who was last committed to the hospital in September, 1952. Tuohy said she telephoned the bets to an outside bookie and carried winnings back to Wanzig.

When arrested, she had \$65 in her possession.

Authorities said Mrs. Hughes told them the betting operations started by a staff physician, who later epistled Wanzig because, he said "the operation is too big for me to handle alone." Mrs. Hughes said she drew a commission on the bets she relayed.

Bettag announced the physician and three other hospital employees have been dismissed, but declined to identify them.

The investigation began after Mrs. Fredonia Jones, 47, was found hanged in her room in the hospital nurses home. State investigators said she mailed a letter earlier that day to her husband, a laundry operator, indicating she was taking her own life because she had lost several thousand dollars betting.

Tuohy said no charge has been filed against Mrs. Hughes, who he said agreed to co-operate in the investigation. He said he did not know whether authorities could proceed against Wanzig, who he said had been committed periodically for suicidal tendencies over a period of 10 years.

Canadian Soldier Makes Use Of Furloughs To See World

HANNOVER, Germany—Holiday visits to 10 countries on three continents have made Sgt. Basil Piper, 34, of Vancouver, probably the most widely-travelled soldier of the 27th Canadian infantry brigade.

Since Sgt. Piper, a bachelor, arrived in Germany in November, 1951, he has used his three annual 14-day leaves to travel in a variety of countries in Europe, Africa and Asia Minor.

Naturally, he's visited such tourist-frequented countries as France, Switzerland and Italy. He has travelled in Greece, Austria, Spain, Portugal and Yugoslavia. He's been in Algeria in Africa and Asiatic Turkey.

He says he has seen, heard and smelled more queer things than he ever dreamed of.

In Algeria—which he reached by airplane—he visited an Arab settlement at the Bou Saada oasis 200 miles south of Algiers. There the desert Arabs live in much the same fashion their ancestors did in past centuries.

While visiting Istanbul, Turkey, he crossed the straits which separate European and Asiatic Turkey, and set foot in Asia Minor. Control of the straits which lead from the Black Sea into the Mediterranean has been an objective of Russian policy for centuries.

Sgt. Piper says he found Greece the most interesting of the countries he has toured, but enjoyed himself most in Spain.

**Ancient Ingot To Be Unveiled**

TRENTON, N.S. (CP)—A steel ingot poured in 1883 will be unveiled by Governor-General Vincent Massey here on Sept. 1 as a monument to the "enterprise and vision" of the pioneers of the steel industry in Canada.

Believed among the first ingots ever poured in Canada, the piece of steel was dug up a few months ago during renovation at the heavy forging plant of Trenton Steel Works Ltd.

Two men who were members of the melting crew here 70 years ago—James Dunn and John W. Fraser, both now over 90—will watch the unveiling.
