**BLACKWOOD on BRIDGE**

**Here Is A Hand That Plays Itself**  
 This is the kind of hand that "plays itself," as the saying goes. As long as the opening lead doesn't get trumped, there is no way for the defenders to win more than one trick regardless of their re-

spective distributions.  
 At no trump play, when you are trying to arrange for an opponent to lead into your ace-queen in a certain suit, it is necessary to strip that oppon-ent of all other suits, before you throw him in the lead.  
 At a suit contract this is often unnecessary. At times, as in today's deal, you can ex-ecute a successful end-play by picking up the outstanding trumps and stripping your own hand and dummy of all suits except the one containing the ten-ace into which you want the enemy to lead. Of course you have to have at least one trump left in each hand.

**SIX HEARTS**  
 Miss Brash bid her head off as usual and Mr. Champion reached a contract of six hearts. Mrs. Keen led the king of spades and dummy's ace won. Now ob-viously Mr. Champion was very much in favor of having Mrs. Keen lead a club. But before putting her in, he had to make sure that all of the spades and diamonds were gone from his hand and dummy.  
 At trick two, then, he led a small spade from the board and ruffed with the ace of hearts. He led a heart to the king, re-turned a diamond to his ace and ruffed a diamond in dummy. He then ruffed dummy's last spade, led his last diamond and ruffed it. Only now did he touch the

CORNWALL, Ont. (CP) - Sec-ond Lieut. Peter Balcombe, 24-year-old officer in the 4th Canadian Guards, Saturday was found guilty of the murder of a vivacious 21-year-old CWAC re-serve army sergeant and was sentenced to be hanged here May 25.  
 Balcombe, married and the father of two children, accept-ed the sentence with the same impassivity he displayed throughout the six-day trial.
